

Lights, Camera, Auction!

Huot students give time to support LNH Children's Auction.

The Huot Technical Center Multimedia Program has developed a unique way to teach live television production. For the entire week of December 9th-13th, students in Ray Sleeper's multimedia classes are giving their time to run cameras for the NH Children's Auction. The LNH Children's Auction is a holiday tradition spanning 31 years of community service. Last year the event raised over \$400,000 to support a variety of charitable activities in the Lakes Region.



Huot students work collaboratively with staff and volunteers from Lakes Region Public Access to broadcast the show live to thousands of homes across the region and state. "It's great, I got to be the technical director on live TV", says Laconia Junior Carly DeNauw.

All told the multimedia program was on-site for 18 hours during the week donating over 100 man-hours of time to the effort. Additionally, many of the students came back in the evening hours to continue helping.

LHS Students Flex Their Robotic Arms

Members of Laconia High School's applied physics class got to use hydraulically controlled robotic arms to do some precision lifting. "They are learning the science behind fluid dynamics and doing it in a very 'hands-on' way" says Jo-Ann Gilbert, LHS teacher. Other projects have included building CO2 propelled dragsters, designing rockets for launch, and solar cars and that the class will also be



building a solar powered oven.

WINTER SPARKLE BATH SALTS

This bath salts recipe will calm any busy teen on a winter's night. Plus they will love the glittery look.

Prep Time: 15 minutes

Total Time: 15 minutes

Ingredients:

- 1 cup Epsom salts
- 1 cup baking soda
- 10 drops blue food coloring
- 1/4 cup of fine glitter; silver
- 15 drops Lavender Essential Oil
- 10 drops Sandalwood Essential Oil
- 10 drops Sweet Orange Essential Oil
- 2 sealable containers or pretty jars

Preparation:

Stir in glitter. Makes two one cup containers. For the Bath: Add 4 tablespoons of bath salts to running water for one full tub.

The Holiday Season is upon us! Your most important responsibility as the host of a Holiday event or party is to take steps to ensure your guests' safety and comfort. If alcoholic drinks are going to be served at your event or party, please consider the following:

Be a Parent not a Pal – model responsible behavior. Providing alcohol to minors is illegal. Make sure that underage youth do not have access to alcohol.

Consider that some of your family/friends may be in recovery from an addiction to alcohol, and they may not make that information public. Do not make alcohol the main focus of the event, and plan to have plenty of non-alcoholic drinks available.

Fun & Tasty Alternatives to Alcoholic Beverages

Cranberry Fizz Punch


- 1 bottle of cranberry juice cocktail, chilled
- 1 bottle of lemon-lime soda, such as Sprite, chilled
- 1 lemon, sliced
- 1 lime, sliced

Just before serving, mix the cranberry juice cocktail and soda in a large pitcher. Add sliced lemon and lime. Makes 6 drinks.

Lemon-Strawberry Punch

- 1 can (6 oz.) frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed
- 1 pkg. frozen sliced strawberries
- 1 can (6 oz.) frozen lemonade concentrate
- 1 quart carbonated water
- 1 quart ginger ale

Thinly sliced oranges or lemons (garnish) Combine frozen lemonade, strawberries (half-thawed with juice), and orange juice. Place in a punchbowl with ice. Just before serving, add carbonated water and ginger ale. Garnish with orange slices. Serves 20.



Christmas Tree Pick-Up




Fundraiser for Laconia Firefighters

Laconia Professional Firefighters have been servicing and supporting our community since 1954.



Please help yourself and your neighbors by shoveling the fire hydrant!

There are more than 500 fire hydrants in Laconia. It can take City firefighters several days to shovel all the hydrants. In addition to shoveling the hydrants the crews must respond to emergency calls. We are averaging 12 calls per day, so it can take several days to shovel every hydrant.

Fire hydrants are very important to help protect your home. Take a moment and shovel or snow blow the fire hydrant in your neighborhood. The home that may be saved may be your own!

Remember it is against the law to push snow against a fire hydrant. If you plow snow against a fire hydrant you will be fined.

Disposal of Christmas Trees
IMPORTANT CHANGE IN PROCEDURE

In an effort to more efficiently and effectively utilize DPW personnel and equipment time, **Christmas Trees will no longer be picked up curbside by Laconia DPW** in the weeks immediately following the Holidays. Laconia residents can transport and drop-off their tree(s) at the following locations for ultimate disposal by DPW:

1. Hilliard Road Brush Dump on Wednesdays in January (Jan 8th, Jan 15th, Jan 22nd and Jan 29th) from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. An attendant will be there to assist you.
2. Laconia Transfer Station, 385 Meredith Center Road. Monday thru Friday from 7:30 am to 3:30 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to Noon. Place trees in the specifically marked/designated area ONLY. PLEASE PULL ON SCALES FIRST!
3. Memorial Park Softball Field off Pearl St (on Memorial Park Drive). Place trees in the specifically marked/designated area ONLY.

Christmas Tree Safety Tips

It's that time of year when Christmas trees are brought into our homes. It's a wonderful time of year, however, it can also be very dangerous. The Christmas tree is probably one of the most recognized seasonal symbols in the world. Unfortunately, a Christmas tree, if not properly cared for, can create a very dangerous fire hazard. Normally, Christmas trees are harvested starting in October. They are then transported throughout the country for sale to the public. By the time you purchase a tree and bring it home the tree could be several months old. Obviously if you cut your own tree it is as fresh as possible. However, once you place the tree indoors the drying process accelerates - Christmas trees must be watered daily.

Our homes are much dryer than normal during the cold weather. This means that a Christmas tree is losing moisture even faster. As soon as you get your tree home place it in a bucket of water. Let it absorb as much water as possible. Be sure you first cut the bottom of the trunk off so there is fresh wood exposed. Most good tree dealers will do this for you.

Every year there are thousands of home fires involving Christmas trees causing damage in the millions. Thirty to 40 people will die in fires as a result of Christmas trees catching fire. Fortunately, the number of home fires related to Christmas trees is steadily declining. This is primarily because of awareness, early detection of fires, and the use of artificial trees.

Christmas trees are a very short term hazard and do produce a high proportionate loss. When a Christmas tree is ignited, the resulting fire is very hot and intense. Fire will spread rapidly and will only take seconds to devour the room it is in. If the tree is near a stairway the fire will spread up the stairs in seconds preventing escape. Any person upstairs will not be able to come down this stairway.

Fortunately, there is an easy way to reduce the risk: water. A Christmas tree needs to be adequately watered every day. The moisture content of the needles will determine how fast a tree can be ignited and then burn. If a tree is baled after cutting this will help retain moisture. Once the wrapping is cut and the branches open up, the tree will quickly start to dry out.

When picking a Christmas tree bounce the tree on the ground. If needles fall off then the tree is already too dry. After you pick your Christmas tree it is very important that you make a fresh cut on the bottom of the trunk. A straight cut is all that is needed. This allows water to travel up through the rings of the tree. Put the tree into a large stand as soon as possible. Keep the stand filled with water at all times. A large tree may soak up to 3 quarts of water per day; especially in the first few days when the tree attempts to rehydrate itself. It is very important to keep a tree adequately watered. If the tree dries out beyond a certain point, it will not rehydrate. According to experts it is best to use plain ordinary tap water. There are a number of additives for sale that claim to reduce the flammability of Christmas trees, but there is no evidence that validates these claims. The best solution is plenty of water - you may need to fill the basin 2 or 3 times per day.

Try to keep your tree away from doorways and stairways. Never place a Christmas tree near a fireplace or other type of heating unit. This will cause the tree to dry out regardless of the amount of water in the tree stand. Check your Christmas lights to make sure they are in good shape. If the wire is worn or frayed throw the lights away and buy new lights. Never use candles on or near a Christmas tree. Always put the lights out if you're leaving the house and before going to bed.

After Christmas remove the tree as soon as possible. It will definitely be dried out by then. Store the tree away from the house. Never store it in the garage, in the basement, or on the porch.

Please heed our advice and you and your family will have a safer holiday season. The Laconia Fire Department would like to take this time to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!
