

USE EXTREME CAUTION ON THE ICE!



On Sunday, January 11th at 7:35 pm Laconia, Gilford, and Belmont responded to Shore Drive for a snowmobile through the ice of Lake Winnisquam.

On the scene, Lt. Desrosiers was met by residents of 350 Shore Drive reporting two victims in the water. One victim had self-rescued and had come to the residents' door requesting help; he then went back out to assist the victim in the water (victim #2). LFD personnel could hear two people out in Lake Winnisquam yelling for help.

Immediately, four LFD firefighters in ice rescue suits headed out on foot. The victims could not be seen from shore. The firefighters made contact with victim #1 on the ice and directed him back to the operations post, which was about 300 feet out from the shore. At this time the firefighters were in verbal contact with victim #2, but did not have a visual. Two rescuers (Firefighters Chris Beaudoin and Kevin Pierce) had to break through the thin ice and then enter the open water and swim approximately 200 feet and made contact with the victim. The victim was placed in a rescue float harness and pulled to solid ice where he was then placed in an ice rescue sled and carried to shore. He was extremely hypothermic as he had been in the water for almost an hour. The rescue took place 1500 feet from the shore line.

Victim 1 was transported to LRGH by Gilford Fire. Victim 2 was transported to LRGH by Belmont Fire. DHART was flown in to LRGH in anticipation of med-flighting Victim 2; however, his condition improved fairly quickly and he was not flown out.

This was a tremendous team effort by the three fire departments and Laconia Police. Fish and Game arrived on scene after the victims had been transported and started an investigation. The two snow mobiles were in at least 130 feet of water.

The firefighters were so far out from shore that you could barely see their flashlights. Relays had to be established setting up multiple rescue ropes. The firefighters did a great job. Their training paid off in huge dividends. Victim 1 reported that he had taken his helmet off and held it against his stomach to act as a flotation device. This probably saved his life. This was the second significant water rescue this winter.

Please be careful on our lakes, ponds and other bodies of water!

A thorough evaluation of current practices will be completed, to ensure continued compliance, coupled with technological best practices.</p>	<p>MIS Robin Moyer assumed the position of Accreditation Manager and has implemented PowerDMS for our CALEA assessment management.</p>
<p>Texting/Distracted Driving Campaign</p>	<p>Texting and driving has become a serious problem in New Hampshire and the nation. Studies have indicated that texting and driving is as dangerous as driving under the influence of alcohol/drugs. Heightened awareness will be gained through education and enforcement campaigns.</p>	<p>Officers have been targeting distracted drivers throughout the year, with an emphasis on education. Hundreds of informational pamphlets have been given to motorists and students/parents at the high school. The State Legislature passed a new hands free law, effective July 1, 2015.</p>
<p>Human Trafficking Awareness/ Education Campaign</p>	<p>Human Trafficking is an ever growing concern in the country and State of New Hampshire. Members of the department have already participated in several awareness events in 2013, and are in the process of planning more in 2014. The education campaign will include the general public and police department personnel.</p>	<p>The department facilitated several more awareness events. Sergeant Swett gave a brief presentation to LPD personnel and other agencies that assist with MC Week. An informational card containing potential warning signs of human trafficking was also handed out to officers.</p>

Educate all employees on available services.</p>	<p>We have focused much attention on monitoring the well being of our employees. Documentation of such incidents and related follow up is being documented with Guardian Tracking. A team of employees are being trained to assist employees during such times.</p>



Anti-Bullying Campaign	Bullying is a growing epidemic across the nation, often times resulting in tragedy. Educate employees on the latest issues and best practices relating to bullying and law enforcement response. Partner with the Laconia School District and other organizations.	The department works very closely with the district schools at all levels. SRO Orton is directly involved with all potential bullying incidents at LHS, often meeting with the students and their parents. He has also presented at several PTO meetings. Officers are assigned to each of the other schools and investigate all allegations of bullying. DARE Officer, Michelle Cardinal and her students, both in the 5 th and 7 th grades, discuss bullying at length.
