

### Tips for protecting trees and shrubs from snow and ice damage

Prevent snow and ice damage to trees! How, you ask? Proper pruning is one way. Particularly important is the removal of hazardous, dead or weak branches. Trees that tend to suffer the worst damage as a result of snow and ice are upright evergreens, like arborvitae and juniper, and clump trees, like birch. Age does not make a tree stronger; younger trees actually tend to survive better in ice storms.

Do not shake limbs to try to remove snow or ice! When you find your trees are bending or drooping as a result of ice and snow accumulation, your first instinct is probably to shake the branches. This may cause breakage or damage. Plants are flexible, so knocking off the weight of accumulation may cause them to "snap" back, potentially damaging the circulatory system. Have an arborist examine damaged branches for signs of weakness.

Safely remove broken limbs. If a limb breaks off from the weight of ice and snow and remains in the tree canopy, have it removed and the stub properly cut as soon as the weather allows. Hanging branches can be a danger to people and property. In addition, the tree will heal better when properly pruned. For undamaged limbs bending under the weight of ice or snow, don't prune as a means of correcting the situation; the limbs should return naturally as weather conditions change. Always be mindful of walking or parking under branches weighed down by snow or ice as they may snap and fall, causing injury or damage. If a limb breaks and becomes entangled in power lines, notify your utility company immediately.

<p><b>Coffee with a Cop</b></p>	<p>One of the department's newest community initiatives, Coffee with a Cop is a nationally recognized program aimed at building and engaging in community problem solving. Schedule six events at strategic locations within the city (April, June, August, September, October, and December).</p>	<p>Five events were held in 2015 at various venues across the city. Approximately eighty citizens joined members of the Department and Police Commission for an hour long dialogue steered by the audience. This initiative will continue into the new year.</p>
<p><b>Police Athletic League</b></p>	<p>The National Police Athletics League's motto is, "It's better to build a youth than mend an adult". Develop a strategy to build a sustainable program in our community. Identify internal/external partners, specific programs, and locations of operation (05/01/15). We intend to promote the interaction of police officers and youth in a positive and safe environment.</p>	<p>Several officers coach Laconia Police Department sponsored sports teams. SRO Orton continues to coach the high school football team and lifts weights with students. The department is in the process of scheduling ongoing sporting events at the Boys and Girls Club.</p>
<p><b>Ward Hall Meetings</b></p>	<p>A community outreach program that brings the police and other community partners to the people. Three meetings will be scheduled at key locations within the city (May, August, and November). Identify partners and develop a model for engaging specific audiences.</p>	<p>The concept was tested at the yearly National Night Out event which was held on the premises of 103 Blueberry Lane. Over a hundred residents enjoyed the activities and had the opportunity to interact with service providers in the community. This initiative is ongoing.</p>
<p><b>Physical Fitness</b></p>	<p>Encourage all employees to engage in physical fitness and healthy living. Provide each employee with a physical fitness evaluation, coupled with an improvement plan. Coordinate a minimum of two fitness challenges. The health and well being of our employees is beneficial on multiple levels, including work productivity, decrease in sick time usage, and overall mental health.</p>	<p>A vast majority of employees continue to be engaged in physical fitness of some sort. Healthy habits are continuously encouraged via e-mails, posters, and Department wide fitness challenges.</p>
<p><b>Police Explorer Post</b></p>	<p>Identify employees with an interest in developing a successful Police Explorer Post (06/01/15). Draft guidelines and program curriculum in accordance with National Law Enforcement Exploring Standards. Meet with members of the Belmont Police Explorer Post for guidance (09/01/15). Recruitment effort and kickoff of program (01/01/16).</p>	<p>A core group of employees interested in this initiative have been identified. Over the last couple of months they have been working with the Daniel Webster Council developing the infrastructure required to sustain a successful program. Partnerships within the community have been made, including the Laconia School District. The recruitment process has commenced with an anticipated kickoff date of February 1<sup>st</sup>.</p>
