From tapping a tree to tasting delicious maple syrup, you will have hands-on participation in every step of the syrup making process. Our environmental educators will help you to build tree ID skills and learn the parts of a tree and their functions, use measuring tools to find an appropriate tree to tap, use historical and modern tree tapping tools, learn the history of maple sugaring including Native American legends, and discover the math and chemical/physical science in the boiling process.

DESIGNATE A SOBER DRIVER

On St. Patrick's Day, everybody's Irish! Unfortunately, nobody's immune to the consequences of drunk driving. Every year, thousands of people needlessly lose their lives in motor vehicle crashes involving impaired drivers and motorcyclists. Last year, 327 of these alcohol-related crashes occurred during the St. Patrick's Day holiday.

And the costs are not only death, disfigurement, disability or injury. There are significant financial costs as well - car repairs, hospital bills, legal fees, bail, higher insurance rates, fines, court costs and lost time at work. Not to mention the trauma and social stigma of being the guy who got busted for drunk driving. It's simply not worth it when there are so many ways to avoid it altogether.



- **Designate a sober driver before you go out to drink.**
- **If you become impaired and don't have a designated driver, call a cab, call a friend or family member, or take a bus.**
- **If you see a friend who is too drunk to drive, take their keys and call them a cab - or drive them home yourself (of course, only if you haven't been drinking).**
- **Consider using your community's safe rides program.**
- **If you see a driver on the road that is obviously driving impaired, don't hesitate to call the law.**

So, whether you're planning a night at the pub or partying with 5,000 of your closest friends in the parade downtown, you can't rely on the luck of the Irish to keep you safe. You have to make your own luck.

Early Desert Rock Climbs



A slideshow and discussion about the early days of rock climbing on the Colorado Plateau will be presented by Taylor Resident George Hurley, an ex-mountaineering guide. The event takes place Wednesday, March 16 at 6:30 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Building. The event is free and open to the public. Please RSVP to ensure seating by calling 524-5600.

The slideshow presentation begins with the first ascent of Shiprock in October 1939. Hurley entered the desert climbing game in the 1950's. In 1962, he, along with Lyton Kor and Huntley Ingalls made the first ascent of the 900-foot Titan and returned in 1966 with TM Herbert and Tom Condon to capture the second ascent. From 1966-1988, Hurley and Bill Forrest made first ascents of most of the spires in the Valley of the Gods in the southeast corner of Utah.

In the 1980's, Hurley, Earl Wiggins and Katy Cassidy climbed towers near Moab. Included in the slideshow will be photographs of the first ascent of the Titan (1962); Standing Rock (1962) and Castleton Tower (1961).

These funds were matched by our national partner NeighborWorks® America. Thanks to the tireless volunteer leadership of Eliza Leadbeater we have completed our Portfolio Strengthening Tax Credit sale.

LACLT is using the funds to upgrade and refinance the first 60 units of permanently affordable housing we developed. This investment will allow for improved properties, improved fiscal performance, stabilized rents, and secure homes.

Through this Portfolio Strengthening initiative we have replaced porches and roofs and completed minor and gut rehabs. Additionally, we installed a new manufactured home at Frances Court in Meredith which is highlighted in more detail on page three.

Since beginning 23 years ago we've been honored to work with hundreds of partners to support our growth from a fledgling start-up to a strong, successful, award-winning organization. However, we are still a small nonprofit that relies on the support of the local community. 



