

## Bicycle Laws and Safety Tips

As the warm weather approaches, the Laconia Police Department would like to remind all bicyclists to be safe and follow the bicycle laws.

Most bicyclist deaths result from bicycle-motor vehicle collisions. But injuries can happen anywhere - in parks, bike paths, and driveways and often do not involve motor vehicles. Head injuries are the most serious injury type and are the most common cause of deaths among bicyclists. The most severe injuries are those to the brain that cause permanent damage. Studies have proven that bicycle helmet use can significantly reduce head injuries.

### Why Wear a Helmet?

A crash can happen to even the most careful person. On any ride you might catch a wheel in a crack in the road surface, skid on gravel, hit a wide pothole or drain gate or collide with a pedestrian, a dog or another vehicle.

Nobody expects a crash, but it is essential to have head protection in case you are involved in one. Road rash and broken bones are painful, but they do heal. Head injuries, however, can cause permanent damage. Bicycle helmets are also required by law for riders under the age of 16. (NH RSA 265:144X)

### Traffic Laws Apply to Bicycles

Every person riding a bicycle has the same rights, privileges, and responsibilities as persons driving cars. Every person riding a bicycle shall have all rights and be subject to the duties applicable to the driver of any other vehicle under the rules of the road. (RSA 265:143)

### Drive Single File

Two riders are safest when riding single file on the right side of the road. Never block traffic by riding two abreast. Persons riding bicycles two or more abreast shall not impede the normal and reasonable flow of traffic and on a laned road shall drive within a single lane. (RSA 265:144V)

### Brakes

In order to ride safely you must be able to stop your bicycle when you want to. Maintain your brakes in good condition and check them before each ride. Every bicycle will be equipped with a brake or brakes which will enable its driver to stop within 25 feet from a speed of 10 mph on dry, level, clean pavement. (RSA 266:88)

### Lights for Night Driving

You must see and be seen to be safe on a bicycle. Most nighttime bicycle accidents are caused by bikes not being seen by other vehicles. Bicycle lamps and reflectors are basic safety equipment. Every bicycle operated during darkness shall be equipped with a lamp emitting a white light visible from a distance of 300 feet in front of the bicycle and with a red reflector on the rear visible to a distance of 300 feet. (RSA 266:86)

### Don't Carry Passengers

Two on a bicycle built for one is double trouble! No bicycle shall be used to carry more persons at one time than the number for which it is designed and equipped. (RSA 265:144 II)

## *News* From the Laconia Water Department



## WHEN SECONDS COUNT

During the cold winter months, broken pipes sometimes occur after the water in them has frozen. Water expands as it freezes, and if the water is trapped inside a pipe with no escape, the expanding ice will cause the pipe to burst. Cracks may appear along the length of a pipe or joints may break away. A burst water pipe can release thousands of gallons of water causing a great deal of damage to your home.

Water in pipes can also freeze even if the house is heated. For example, freezing can occur when pipes run through an unheated attic, garage or crawl space. All may be well during the day when water is in frequent use, since the constant flow

keeps bringing in warmer water. However, at night, when the water is not moving and the temperature continues to drop, those pipes can freeze. We have responded to numerous cases of frozen pipes this winter and the sooner we can contact property owners the better off they are. Please help us help you by filling out the contact form referenced below. This will allow us to update our records to reach you in an emergency.

## **NAMI NH's National Best Practice Connect Suicide Post-vention Training**

*coming to Franklin Regional Hospital March 25th*

*Training assists communities to develop safe response to suicide and traumatic deaths*

A suicide or other untimely traumatic death can have a devastating impact on a community. The shock and grief goes well beyond immediate family and can ripple throughout the community affecting friends, coworkers/workplaces, schools, and faith communities.

A team of professionals who know what to do, are trained and prepared to act, and have an action plan in place will promote healing and reduce risk after a suicide in light of the bewilderment and turmoil that often occurs.

The training includes the *Connect* suicide post-vention curriculum, best practice post-vention protocols, and the development of a comprehensive community post-vention response plan with assistance from the *Connect* trainer/consultant.

Training highlights include:

- **How to coordinate a safe and supportive response to a suicide**
- **Selecting a post-vention response coordinator and team members and their respective roles**
- **Communication among team members**
- **Best practices such as how to communicate safely about suicide and restricting the availability of lethal means (e.g. guns, pills)**
- **Post-vention protocols for specific service providers (e.g. mental health, law enforcement, education, social services)**
- **Surveillance of community “hot spots” to minimize future risk**
- **How to help individuals, families, and communities heal**
- **Managing compassion fatigue**
- **Creating a suicide post-vention response plan, including immediate and long term actions**

The training is one day and for those looking to become trainers will be combined with *Connect* post-vention train-the-trainer for a total of three days. Cost of the training is FREE to participants.

Targeted audience are professionals whose job entails responding to a suicide death, including behavioral health professionals, guidance counselors, law enforcement, faith leaders, school personnel, members of suicide prevention coalitions, human resource departments and disaster response teams.


