


**The next recycling collection week begins Monday, March 25th!**

#### January Training: Belknap Regional SOG Ops







## 2013 Taylor Community Music Series

The Laconia Police Department has received several complaints of a scam regarding homes for rent in Laconia. The victims responded to rental ads on Craigslist which turned out to be fraudulent.

The scammers appear to be copying legitimate advertised homes for sale in Laconia and making fake ads of the same home with the scammers' contact information. The scammers report that they are out of the country and request personal information and a down payment to be sent to them. This particular scam appears to have originated in Nigeria.





## Sanitary Sewer and Water Main Upgrade Project



The Department of Public Works will begin work shortly (with a target date of no later than April 1st) on a sewer upgrade in the area of South Main Street at Pine Street/Bowman Street. The work will continue for approximately eight weeks with the hope to conclude the project before Memorial Day weekend.

For at least the past 10 years, DPW has been experiencing increasing flow problems with a section of the sanitary sewer in this area of the City. This sewer was built in the 1890's and has several deficiencies. Once the sewer work is completed, the full roadway portion between Cottage St. and the Main St./Union Ave./Court St. intersection will be upgraded.

## Updates from the Planning Office...

The City of Laconia has recently installed nine sets of banner poles and is now leasing space to hang banners promoting local non-profit or cultural civic events or activities of particular interest or benefit to the Lakes Region in general and Laconia specifically. The locations available are:

A	Court Street	Near Belmont Town line (in front of St. Francis Home)
B	Union Avenue	Just north of Black Brook Bridge
C	Weirs Blvd.	Approx 120' north of house # 30
D	Weirs Blvd.	Just north of Ridgehaven Condos (# 109 Weirs Blvd.)
E	Weirs Blvd.	Just north of entrance to Evergreens Condos
F	Weirs Blvd.	Just north of the Christmas Island Steak House
G	Weirs Blvd.	Just north of the Chamber of Commerce info. booth
H	Lakeside Ave.	Close to intersection with Endicott Street North
I	Lakeside Ave.	Close to Crazy Gringo and Paradise Beach Club restaurants

The banners can be hung for a maximum timeframe of two weeks. The City wants to schedule annual events for these banners as early in the year as possible so we are contacting people now who may be interested in hanging banners at any time during 2013. Usage will be assigned on a first come-first served basis. The application is available online at : <http://www.city.laconia.nh.us/index.php/departments/zoning-inside/sign-regulation> . The fee, as noted in the application, will be \$50.00 per banner, per week.

# Conservation Commission News...

It's hard to remember the heat of summer this time of year, but it is often the winter snowpack that helps determine how dry the summer months will be. During the driest summer months water demand can exceed supply in many New Hampshire communities. So it is important for individuals to landscape sections of their property with low water demanding plants.

The Laconia Conservation Commission likes to remind everyone that maintaining your entire shoreline with lawn only may negatively impact our water supply. Lack of a filter strip and fertilizer runoff close to the water's edge may cause water pollution – this is especially important for Paugus Bay, the City's drinking water source.

The Laconia Conservation Commission suggests you maintain your shore-front with low water demanding vegetation. Laconia does not allow healthy trees to be cut 50-feet from the shore so this makes your task even easier. Maintaining a healthy shoreline tree canopy allows summer water temperatures to support healthy fish habitat, reduces milfoil propagation, and maintains water quality. GSAMA serves New Hampshire's aviation needs by enhancing access to the National Airspace System, promoting a support network for all airports in the State, and promoting legislation in support of aviation interests.

The NH Pilot's Association (nhpilot.org), National Business Aviation Association (nbaa.org), National Association of State Aviation Officials (naaso.org), Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (aopa.org), and the National Air Transportation Association (nata.org), were also specifically recognized in the governor's proclamation.


