*Becoming Wolf: the Eastern  
Coyote in New England*  
With Christine Schadler, M.S.,  
M.A., Wild Canid Ecologist

Tuesday, April 14th 6:30 pm

Beginning in the early 1990's, Christine Schadler taught Conservation Issues and Wolf Ecology at UNH. While wolf recovery was the focus of her early work, her attention shifted to the eastern coyote when she moved to New England. She chose a farm with known coyote problems to raise sheep and train her border collies. Using sound livestock management and common sense, she has avoided any predation for nearly two decades with a peaceful co-existence between coyote and livestock. Chris divides her time between teaching on the NH Seacoast and working on her book "Becoming Wolf: The Eastern Coyote in New England". Between presentations she can be found at camp in northern NH tracking coyotes, howling for wolves or leading treks into Canada to study wild canids.

## LACONIA STORES GET READY FOR OPERATION STICKER SHOCK BY LMS JAG STUDENTS

## CITY OF LACONIA LAKEPORT AND WEIRS TAX INCREMENT FINANCING (TIF) ADVISORY BOARDS

The Lakeport and Weirs TIF Advisory Boards were established on August 8, 2011 and February 25, 2013, respectively, to advise the City Council on planning, construction and implementation of the development program and maintenance and operation issues within the Lakeport and Weirs TIF Districts.

In order to bring the Lakeport and Weirs TIF Advisory Boards' makeup in line with the Downtown TIF Advisory Board and other City Boards and Commissions, the City Council recently voted that the Boards should consist of five members appointed for 3-year terms. All Board members shall own property, reside or own/manage/represent a business/organization within the Districts.

Initial staggering of terms shall be two 3-year terms, two 2-year terms and one 1-year term, with a majority of the Board being Laconia residents. Terms will then each be three year terms upon reappointment going forward. Terms will begin July 1, 2015.




