**German Town: The Lost Story Of Seaford Town, Jamaica** is a documentary that explores the history of German heritage within Westmoreland, Jamaica.

Deep within the isolated, undeveloped mountains of Westmoreland lies a village with a history and people unique to Jamaica. It is said that the inhabitants of this village are descendants of German indentured servants, who were used to work the Jamaican plantations after the emancipation period, to substitute the slave labor that drove the islands economy.

Others think they came under different circumstances such as runaway prisoners, former military battered after the Napoleonic wars, seeking a better life to escape poverty and hardships in their home lands. This documentary project explores the history and contemporary life of Jamaicans of German heritage.

Laconia Housing Authority (LHA) supportive service department is celebrating twenty-five years of serving LHA residents, Family Self Sufficiency participants, and applicants. The first employee was hired in 1989 as a resident service coordinator and later served as the first director of the department which grew to twenty employees in the first 10 years. Current staff includes resident service coordinators, nurses, LNA's, dietary staff, and housekeepers.

The supportive service staff strives to maintain the residents housing stability and to promote independence, dignity, and a high quality of life. The goal of the resident service coordinator is to assist all residents in identifying and accessing services and resources within the organization, community or government agencies or through private resources. The department also operates two supported living programs which provide meals, housekeeping, laundry, nursing services, personal care, transportation to medical appointments, and an emergency response system for qualified individuals. In an average year the department serves 35,000 meals, provides 4,596 hours of housekeeping services, and completes 3,312 loads of laundry. The LHA Home Health Agency nurses visit clients on a regular schedule and the LNAs provide personal care up to five times per week if necessary. LHA contracts with NH Emergency Response System who monitors at least 30 emergency call units and staff schedule approximately 1,500 visits to medical appointments. These services are in addition to the daily support provided which may include some shopping, errands, assistance with phone calls, completing paperwork, etc. Individuals do not need to participate in the assisted living program to benefit from the services as many are available to all tenants.

The supportive service department is always looking for volunteers to assist with social activities. Currently the department has a Senior Community Employment Program participant who schedules various activities during the week including movies, tea socials, trivia, bingo, and holiday parties. Community volunteers provide clinics, book clubs, bible study, music, sing-a-longs, etc. Anyone interested in volunteering should contact the Service Coordinator by calling Nancy at 524-2112 x 28 or submit a contact request through our website at [www.laconiahousing.org](http://www.laconiahousing.org).



## The Invisible People

**I**nvisible to many, the homeless are facing problems of their own making and from circumstances beyond their control. Once in that situation, it is difficult to recover. However, some are finding programs where they can gain a sense of self-worth, discovering hidden talents and ways to make a fresh start.

“The Invisible People” is a documentary highlighting an art and photography project in Laconia and a transitional program in Canaan where those willing to put in the effort can gain new skills that offer a step up and perhaps out of their difficulties.

River Crew Art in Laconia provides art supplies and cameras to the homeless, guiding them in sharpening their skills and gaining a sense of accomplishment. Meeting on Monday mornings, the program provides a supportive environment for experimentation, followed by a hot meal for the participants. Each year, River Crew Art holds an art and photography show where their creations are put on exhibition, to critical acclaim.

A Sacred Place in Canaan offers a safe location for those willing to work with farm animals and gain agricultural skills. More importantly, those camping there will have a permanent address to use in applying for work and benefits. The hours may be long, but the work is not difficult and it produces new skills that participants can rely on when they are ready to move on. The program has given a boost to those who are sincere about trying to turn their lives around.




As we work on improving our roads, you may have noticed significant activity on Union Avenue. Work at that location during this construction season includes water main, natural gas, sewer, road and sidewalk upgrades.

The project will be in two phases, currently anticipated to be as follows: Phase 1-Messer St. to approx. Walker St., roadway and utilities: April 7<sup>th</sup> thru May 23<sup>rd</sup> (sidewalk and curb work continuing until June 13<sup>th</sup>); Phase 2-Walker St. to Gilford Ave.: July 7<sup>th</sup> thru October 10<sup>th</sup>. During the construction day, traffic will be northbound only; southbound traffic will be detoured (see [Phase 1](#) and [Phase 2](#) detour plans). On weekends and evenings Union Avenue will be open to two-way traffic.
