With bitter cold, dense fog, heavy snow, and record winds, 6,288-foot Mount Washington is New England's highest peak and is known for unpredictable and dangerous weather. But why, for a mountain its size, does Mount Washington actually see the World's Worst Weather? Join Mount Washington Observatory's Will Broussard for a hands-on session that will focus on the unique weather of the summit as well as the weather observers who man the observatory year-round. This program will combine interactive demonstrations, weather instruments, images, and video footage to bring the Mount Washington summit to Laconia. We will explore how the mountain's weather works and what it can tell us about our own unique New England weather patterns.







The Lakeport and Weirs TIF Advisory Boards were established on August 8, 2011 and February 25, 2013, respectively, to advise the City Council on planning, construction and implementation of the development program and maintenance and operation issues within the Lakeport and Weirs TIF Districts.

In order to bring the Lakeport and Weirs TIF Advisory Boards' makeup in line with the Downtown TIF Advisory Board and other City Boards and Commissions, the City Council recently voted that the Boards should consist of five members appointed for 3-year terms. All Board members shall

own property, reside or own/manage/represent a business/organization within the Districts.

Initial staggering of terms shall be two 3-year terms, two 2-year terms and one 1-year term, with a majority of the Board being Laconia residents. Terms will then each be three year terms upon reappointment going forward. Terms will begin July 1, 2015.

# New Hampshire's Hands Free Law will take effect **July 1, 2015**

- No use of **hand held electronic** devices while driving or temporarily halted in traffic for a stop sign or traffic signal or other momentary delays
- This includes cell phones, GPS, tablets, iPods, iPads or other devices that require data entry
- Emergency calls to 911 will be allowed
- Bluetooth or other **hands-free** electronic devices will be allowed
- **One hand** non-cellular 2-way radio use will be allowed
- Teen drivers under the age of 18 will not be allowed to use **any** electronic devices except to report an emergency

If your vehicle is not equipped with Bluetooth functionality, after-marked systems can be installed or a Bluetooth speaker or over the ear device can be purchased at many retail stores including cell phone carriers and online distributors.

### Penalties for Violations

1st Offense - \$100 fine 2nd offense - \$250 fine

3rd Offense within 2 years - \$500 fine

Penalty assessments will be added to the fines
