On what should have been a happy, normal Friday afternoon, two middle school students and their families would forever have their lives changed on April 19th by a devastating accident which took the life of Lily Johnson and seriously injured Allyssa Miner.

Laconia is a strong, close-knit community where friends and neighbors come together to support and stand beside each other when times are tough. ## Remember Your Setbacks When Planning Your Next Project!



The Spring season brings green grass, emerging flowers, and the onset of outdoor construction projects. Spring is also the beginning of the 'super busy' time of year for the Planning and Zoning Department. The Department will spend countless hours on the phone, in meetings, and walking sites to help numerous projects, ranging from small sheds to large commercial and multi-unit residential developments, come to fruition. Many of these hours are spent explaining and measuring setbacks.

When you are planning your next project please remember your setback requirements. Setback requirements vary from Zoning District to Zoning District. Visit webpage <http://www.city.laconia.nh.us/index.php/departments/zoning-inside/zoning-ordinance> and click on "Article VI – Dimensional Standards" to view the setback requirements. Keep in mind that structures are not allowed within property setbacks (structures include sheds, buildings, additions, patios, decks, etc...) and that setbacks are measured from your property line, not from the edge of the street.



There are also setback requirements from wetlands, lakes, rivers, and brooks – because these areas have restrictions relative to cutting trees and shrubs, adding grass or parking, placement of structures, etc... it is best to speak with Staff before partaking in any activity within 100' of water/wetlands.

### **Low & Moderate Income Homeowner's Property Tax Relief**

*Important  
DATE!*

Now is the time to file for NH State Low and Moderate Income Homeowner's Property Tax Relief! Form DP-8 must be filed no later than June 30, 2013. The State no longer mails the forms to property taxpayers who have filed in prior years.

You are eligible to file for this tax relief if:

- You own a homestead subject to the state education property tax;
- You have resided in such homestead on April 1 of the year for which the claim for relief is made;
- You have a total adjusted gross household income of \$20,000 or less if a single person, or \$40,000 or less if married or head of a NH household.

Be sure to attach a copy of your final 2012 property tax bill and your 2012 federal tax return for each claimant and all adult members of the claimant's household for the corresponding period.

## Solid Waste Collection

### Refuse Container Size/Weight and Curbside Container Quantity Limits

Current City Ordinance states the following regarding refuse containers for household garbage and rubbish:

Every householder shall provide and maintain in proper order for the purpose of sorting and putting out for collection of garbage a sufficient number of tightly sealed containers having a capacity of not more than 30 gallons each. No container shall have a height greater than 36 inches or less than 18 inches and no container shall weigh more than 50 pounds.

Single Family and Duplex Residential Dwellings are allowed two (2) containers per week.

Multi-Family Dwellings and Commercial Establishments are allowed seven (7) containers per week.

Under circumstances where both Residential and Commercial definitions apply to the building, the maximum number of containers that may be put out for collection shall not exceed nine (9) containers.

Voluntary recycling is **strongly encouraged** and curbside collection is available to all residents on an every-other-week basis on solid waste curbside collection routes. Residents **NOT** on curbside collection routes are invited to use remote recycling drop-off sites located at:

257 Messer Street/behind the old DPW Garage Building  
Behind the Lakeport Fire Station  
The front parking lot of the Weirs Community Center  
On Lindsay Court across from Memorial Park Club House

All of these locations are open 24-hours per day/7 days-per week and are lighted for your safety.

The Laconia Transfer Station / Recycling Center is open  
Monday through Friday from 7:30 am to 3:30 pm & Saturday from 8:00 am to Noon

Recycling materials need **NOT** be sorted and include the following:

Glass bottles and jars, all colors, metal lids thrown away

Steel and aluminum cans, labels removed if possible

Plastics with the number 1-7 in the triangular recycling symbol on the bottom of the product.

**EXCEPTIONS: NO Styrofoam and OR Plastic Bags of any kind**

Cardboard, paperboard and paper of all kinds- newspaper, office paper, old mail, magazines, shiny inserts, paperback books, paper of all colors and types.

The rule-of-thumb is...."if you can tear it with your hands, It is recyclable...."

18-gallon recycling containers are available free of charge at the Department of Public Works. 2-wheeled, 64-gallon recycling containers with a hinged lid are also available at DPW. The cost of the first container is \$25 (with the City supporting the remaining \$20 of the program cost) with additional totes available at \$45.00 each. Please note – any sturdy containers CLEARLY MARKED as **RECYCLING** can be used. DPW also has free recycling stickers to use for this purpose.



## *Enjoy Living History with the Old Country Fiddler*



For more than 40 years, beginning in 1895, musical humorist Charles Ross Taggart performed in lyceum and Chautauqua circuits throughout the United States. He made 40 recordings with the Victor, Edison and Columbia companies and appeared in a 1923 Phono-Film “talkie” four years before Al Jolson starred in “The Jazz Singer.”

Living history presenter Adam Boyce brings Taggart to life Wednesday, May 8 at 7 p.m. in Taylor Community’s Woodside Building, 435 Union Ave. Boyce portrays Taggart near the end of his career in 1936, sharing recollections of his life, live fiddling and humorous sketches.

Vermonters Adam Boyce is a noted fiddler and lifelong student of history. He’s composed more than 100 fiddle tunes and is a Juried Artist with the Vermont Arts Council.

## National Take Back Initiative

April 27, 2013




On Saturday, April 27, 2013, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) is coordinating a nationwide one-day collaborative effort with state and local law enforcement agencies to remove potentially dangerous controlled substances from our nation's homes.

This national initiative will again provide an opportunity for the public to surrender pharmaceutical controlled substances and other medications to law enforcement officers for destruction. Expired, unused, or unwanted controlled substances in our homes are a potential source of supply for the increasing abuse of pharmaceutical drugs in the United States and an unacceptable risk to public health and safety.

The Laconia Police Department is joining this effort by participating and encouraging our citizens to take advantage of this day. We are asking the citizens of Laconia to please bring their unneeded medication to the Laconia Police Department on April 27, 2013 between the hours of 10:00 am and 2:00 pm for disposal. The Laconia Police will also pick up your medications at your residence if needed. No questions will be asked upon drop off or pickup by the Laconia Police Department.

The Laconia Police Department does have a PERMANENT medication collection box located in the front foyer of the Laconia Police Department. This collection box addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. The collection box is accessible 24 hours / day / 7 days / week. If you have any questions or concerns please contact Capt. William Clary prior to April 27, 2013 or ask for the Watch Supervisor on duty on April 27, 2013.
