


Join us on Saturday, May 16th at 10:00 am for the 3rd annual Library Community Walk!



Let's "Jamma Scammer"

SCAMS

TARGET YOU

PROTECT YOURSELF

Every week, and nearly every day, we receive reports from people who have either been scammed, or think someone attempted to scam them. The variety of scams is only limited by the imagination and ingenuity of these criminals. Here are some highlights:

Phone Scams: All shapes and sizes here. From direct requests for personal and financial information, to phony sales calls, to hang up calls trying to get you to call back, to false information about relatives being held by the police and bail money needing to be sent **right away**.

Mail Scams: Any piece of unsolicited mail should be looked at with great skepticism. If it comes from a company that you don't know and/or don't do business with, doubt long and trust short.

E-mail: The number one export of Nigeria is monetary scams and US citizens have been some of their best customers. If winning an international lottery you did not enter, or helping a Nigerian prince move international assets sounds like a scam to you, **IT IS**.

Websites: Entering a website and giving any information about yourself can be EXTREMELY hazardous to your financial health. Be very suspicious and only deal with companies you know at web addresses you enter yourself. Some websites can look very much like the company you have your Visa account with, but all you're doing is letting some miscreant play merry with your accounts and personal information.

"IRS": These come in all of the above formats with someone pretending to be the Internal Revenue Service. A genuine communication from the IRS can be verified by calling legitimate phone numbers for the IRS. If it looks like it might be a fake, don't be taken in.

BOTTOM LINE: Treat your personal information like your wallet—keep it close to you and don't let just anyone get their fingers into it. The best way to "Jamma Scammer" is to not take the bait. If it looks like it might be a scam, it probably is and you should never send money or financial information to someone you do not know. Locate the official website or phone number of whatever company you are dealing with and go from there. Scammers are under the gun to make the sale right then and there and if they get anxious if you say you want to call back and ask for their info, then they probably are not legitimate. Don't let anyone rush you or convince you to do something against your better judgment.

Together we can "Jamma Scammer"!

**CITY OF LACONIA
LAKEPORT AND WEIRS
TAX INCREMENT FINANCING (TIF) ADVISORY BOARDS**

The Lakeport and Weirs TIF Advisory Boards were established on August 8, 2011 and February 25, 2013, respectively, to advise the City Council on planning, construction and implementation of the development program and maintenance and operation issues within the Lakeport and Weirs TIF Districts.

In order to bring the Lakeport and Weirs TIF Advisory Boards' makeup in line with the Downtown TIF Advisory Board and other City Boards and Commissions, the City Council recently voted that the Boards should consist of five members appointed for 3-year terms. All Board members shall own property, reside or own/manage/represent a business/organization within the Districts.

Initial staggering of terms shall be two 3-year terms, two 2-year terms and one 1-year term, with a majority of the Board being Laconia residents. Terms will then each be three year terms upon reappointment going forward. Terms will begin July 1, 2015.





LAST CHANCE TO SIGN UP FOR LRGS' SENIOR DIVISION!

May 10th is the last day to sign up for our 14U & 18U teams. To play for LRGs, girls must be between the ages of 13 and 18 (as of Dec. 31, 2014). Our senior divisions are open to players from all around Central NH & the Lakes Region.

Senior Division Frequently Asked Questions:

How long is the season? Approximately 6-8 weeks. Practices will start mid-late May, and end in early July. LRGs does not schedule events Memorial Day Weekend or on the 4th of July.

Will it interfere with school softball? No. While we may have a few practices, our game schedule won't start until the school season is over.

Where will practices/games take place? LRGs will use fields in Belmont & Laconia for practices & home games. Teams will travel for away games (locations to be determined).

What is the commitment level? Typically 2-3 events per week. The schedule is a work in progress and subject to change.

What if I play another sport, have a part time job or have a vacation planned? No problem! Game and practice schedules are handed out early in the season to give players and families a chance to review for any conflicts. If there are conflicts, players should let their coaches know as soon as possible.

What does it cost to play? The registration fee is \$65 per player (family discount available). Players are also asked to participate in the league fundraiser. Uniforms are provided for that fee.




