After hearing your ideas, conducting months of meetings and planning sessions, here are some of our upcoming projects to create a healthier, more vibrant community!

Funding from HEAL NH and the City of Laconia will allow us to make the following improvements around Wyatt Park over the next few months:

WATER BUBBLER/BOTTLE FILLING STATION will be installed in the park

HIGH VISIBILITY SIGNS and other pedestrian safety features will be added around the park

New **FENCING**

The **BASKETBALL COURT** will be **RESURFACED**

A **WALKING PATH** along the outside perimeter will be installed

LIGHTING will be installed inside the park for safety

COMMUNITY CELEBRATION in Wyatt Park this summer to celebrate the improvements to the Wyatt Park-South End Neighborhood

The projects below are being discussed and we hope to have decisions soon about other improvements to help increase safe access to and physical activity within Wyatt Park:

RELOCATE CURRENT CROSSWALK from Province Street to the Park to provide easier, safer access

CROSSWALK installed across Champlin Street

TIPDOWNS – ADA compliant sections of the crosswalk – on the South Main Street side

NEW PAVEMENT laid on Champlin Street

Safety and cosmetic **IMPROVEMENTS TO THE PARKSIDE SIDEWALK** on Champlin Street (lowering and re-grading the sidewalk and installing granite curbing and a sub-lawn)

Treatment Facility Upgrade

Over the last couple of years the Water Department has been in the midst of a large treatment facility upgrade. The department originally began this project back in 2011. After receiving cost estimates for as much as \$1.5 million dollars from contractors that perform this type of work, the department decided to perform the upgrade using their own staff. This decision allowed us to not only gather “Hands-on Knowledge” but also produced a considerable cost savings.


The treatment plant has a total of three identical filter units called trains which are capable of processing water at approximately 1,200-1,500 gallons per minute (GPM). Each train consists of two parts, the first being the clarifier which removes approximately 80 percent of the particles, also known as turbidity, from the raw water. The water then passes through our mixed media filters. The media, which consist of anthracite coal, silica, sand and high density silica sand, helps to polish and remove the remaining loose particles.



Just like we were able to do back in 2011, the department was able to take the train “off line” during the late fall and winter seasons. This allowed for the train to be completely isolated in containment for full preparation of sand blasting and painting in order to improve the appearance, minimize the maintenance and expand the life expectancy of the unit. This portion of the work was contracted out to professionals. This process including the paint took about 6 weeks before we were ready to place new filter media back in the train.



Although our experience level has increased due to having done the placing of the material once before, this train presented other challenges not encountered in the first train. One of the major obstacles faced during this renovation was the ability to get the materials up and over the first train without causing any damage. After some in-house engineering and a lot of time and effort invested by our employees, a plan was developed which was executed without any problems. The installation of the filter media required 42 tons of material to be hand placed in seven different layers. The placement of this material took approximately 3 days including the “floating” and disinfection process of the material.



At this time the media is in place. We are in the process of doing final touches to the train and it should be back on line within the next few weeks!

Laconia Fire Department along with crews from Gilford, Belmont, Meredith, Franklin, and Tilton battled a two-alarm fire on Sunday, April 28th at a horse farm on White Oaks Road. It was an intense fire that completely consumed a very large wood frame barn and also damaged or destroyed six motor vehicles, two pick-up trucks, a boat, several construction trailers and numerous pieces of construction equipment. There were several explosions early in the fire from LP tanks in the barn. A house 30 feet away and a second large barn that had miniature ponies inside were both saved. The smoke from the fire could be seen for miles.

On Saturday evening, April 27th, Laconia and Gilford crews fought a fire at 115 Winter Street. The fire started in the kitchen and spread rapidly throughout the first floor. The home received significant damage. The lesson learned at this fire is to call the Fire Department immediately – even if you think you can control the fire yourself.

We are in the peak brush fire season... the ground is dry and there is no appreciable rain in sight. So be very careful with any outdoor fire. Remember – permits are required to burn outdoors – brush piles, or campfires. They are available at either fire station. At this time burning is allowed after 5pm with a permit. This is subject to change especially if the wind picks up. The threat will lower after we get some substantial rain, and as soon as the leaves start to open on the trees. The leaves actually help retard fire spread because the fire must dry out the moisture in the green leaves before they burn.

City Council Budget Hearings Continue Monday, May 6th, 6 pm





Low & Moderate Income Homeowner's Property Tax Relief

Important DATE!

Now is the time to file for NH State Low and Moderate Income Homeowner's Property Tax Relief! Form DP-8 must be filed no later than June 30, 2013. The State no longer mails the forms to property taxpayers who have filed in prior years.

You are eligible to file for this tax relief if:

- You own a homestead subject to the state education property tax;
- You have resided in such homestead on April 1 of the year for which the claim for relief is made;
- You have a total adjusted gross household income of \$20,000 or less if a single person, or \$40,000 or less if married or head of a NH household.

Be sure to attach a copy of your final 2012 property tax bill and your 2012 federal tax return for each claimant and all adult members of the claimant's household for the corresponding period.
