Laconia Firefighters will be out every day this month testing all the fire hoses. Each year the Fire Department pressure tests (250 PSI) more than two miles of hose including those for fire attack and for supplying water from fire hydrants.

This testing takes several days in order to complete each truck and all the spare hose. Making sure the hose is safe is imperative so that there are no critical failures at a fire.


The new, updated course is scheduled for Thursday, May 29 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Taylor Community's Woodside Building, 435 Union Ave. Class size is limited to 20 people. To sign up, please call 524-

5600, Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. The nominal fee is \$15 for AARP members and \$20 for non-members, payable the day of class. AARP members should bring their cards. There will be a break for lunch and the Woodside Café is available for dining.

This course will help participants:

- Learn research-based safety strategies that can reduce the likelihood of having a crash
- Understand the link among the driver, vehicle, and road environment, and how this awareness encourages safer behavior
- Learn how aging, medications, alcohol and other health-related issues affect driving ability and ways to adjust how to allow for these changes
- Increase confidence
- Know how to drive safely when sharing the road with other road users
- Learn the newest safety and advanced features in vehicles
- Learn when driving may no longer be safe
- Explore other ways to travel

Some automobile insurance companies in New Hampshire provide discounts to participants who complete this course. People are encouraged to check with their respective insurance agents for more information.



## **Union Ave. Construction Project**

As we work on improving our roads, you may have noticed significant activity on Union Avenue. Work at that location during this construction season includes water main, natural gas, sewer, road and sidewalk upgrades.

The project will be in two phases, currently anticipated to be as follows: Phase 1-Messer St. to approx. Walker St., roadway and utilities: April 7<sup>th</sup> thru May 23<sup>rd</sup> (sidewalk and curb work continuing until June 13<sup>th</sup>); Phase 2-Walker St. to Gilford Ave.: July 7<sup>th</sup> thru October 10<sup>th</sup>. During the construction day, traffic will be northbound only; southbound traffic will be detoured (see [Phase 1](#) and [Phase 2](#) detour plans). On weekends and evenings Union Avenue will be open to two-way traffic.

The Bi-Annual Northern New England Police Accreditation Coalition Conference was held at Steele Hill Resort from May 7 - May 9, 2014. Attending from the Laconia Police Department were Capt. William Clary, Accreditation Manager Robin Moyer and Assistant Accreditation Manager Lt. Alfred Lessard.

The conference consisted of numerous classes on keeping Accreditation files up to date with changes in CALEA (Commission of Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies) Standards. Attendees also listened to two guest speakers; Communications Director, Maureen Will of the Newtown, CT Police Department concerning the Sandy Hook Elementary School Shooting and

Captain Raymond Dupuis of the Watertown, MA Police Department concerning the capture of the Boston Marathon Bombing Suspect. Both speakers gave riveting accounts of the ordeal their Departments faced and highlighted the lessons learned during an active shooter incident.

The Laconia Police Department recently purchased PowerDMS, a cloud-based computer software program for managing both CALEA accreditation and training files electronically. Representatives from PowerDMS gave a demonstration of the software and fielded questions from current users and those seeking to purchase the product.

The Laconia Police Department facilitated the Opening Ceremonies for the conference. 

## High Fructose Corn Syrup

Recently there has been a resurgence of information about the “dangers” of high fructose corn syrup. In January, a study concluded that fructose consumption, as compared to glucose, resulted in a different pattern of blood flow in the appetite and reward areas of the brain. Previous studies have shown that fructose consumption does not increase insulin and suppress ghrelin like glucose, so that people do not feel as “full” after eating fructose.

The problem with the information in these studies is that they test consumption of pure fructose and pure glucose. We rarely ever eat just fructose or just glucose. Most of the simple sugars we consume are a combination of the two. High fructose corn syrup is not pure fructose, but rather a combination of fructose and glucose. The high fructose corn syrup in sodas is 55% fructose and 45% glucose, and the high fructose corn syrup in baked goods is 42% fructose and 58% glucose, these compare to table sugar (sucrose) which is 50% fructose 50% glucose. Note that some high fructose corn syrups have less fructose

than table sugar! And, as for other sweeteners, such as evaporated cane juice, honey, brown rice syrup, agave nectar, barley malt syrup, and juice concentrates, these are all combinations of fructose and glucose as well.

There are a few foods that contain pure fructose. Unfortunately these are often confused with “healthy foods” and include Vitamin Water, Kashi GoLEAN protein and fiber bars and Weight Watchers yogurt. These foods should be limited as they may not be as filling for the same amount of calories.

As stated in a recent article (Lowndes 2012) “common misunderstandings about high fructose corn syrup (HFCS) have distorted public perceptions pressuring food manufacturers to replace HFCS with sucrose and municipal and state legislators to mandate removal of HFCS from school nutrition programs.....such actions are pointless and potentially misleading to consumers, since HFCS and sucrose are nutritionally interchangeable.”

**The bottom line: Reducing overall sugar/sweetener intake, rather than choosing one type over another, is the most beneficial change to make.**
