




Recently the Laconia High School (LHS) Key Club, sponsored by Kiwanis, volunteered their time to design and install a rain garden at the Tardif Park House near the banks of Jewett Brook. The garden's plants and soil will filter pollutants from storm water (rain and/or snow melt) draining from the park house roof before it enters Jewett Brook, and help to reduce flooding by retaining water. In addition to the environmental benefits, this project helps the City raise landowner awareness on caring for the brook as outlined in the 2012 Jewett Brook Watershed Plan.

"The whole project was initiated by the students. They approached the Laconia Conservation Commission asking if there was a project they could do that would help the City. The idea of a rain garden came up and the students made it happen." stated Lisa Morin a Conservation Commission member. The LHS Key Club partnered with the Conservation Commission, the Parks and Recreation Department, the Public Works Department, and Petal Pushers Farm to obtain guidance and generously donated or discounted materials for the project. Key Club members became familiar with the purpose and function of rain gardens, learned about the plants they installed, and determined the shape and planting scheme of the garden. Several Kiwanis members joined in the fun working with the students on the garden, and then hosted a pizza party once the work was done.

This rain garden is just one of a long list of projects taken on by LHS Key Club during this school year. Other projects include, but are not limited to, assisting with Hands Across the Table, Pumpkin Fest, participating in a bike safety day, raising awareness about homelessness, and hosting a Senior to Senior Dance at the Community Center that sees High School seniors socializing with elders from the community.




