

### PSS named Healthiest School in New Hampshire

Pleasant Street School was presented with an award signifying its designation as the "Healthiest Elementary School in New Hampshire" for the 2014-2015 school year. PSS was chosen for the award following an on-site visit in April and in comparison with schools across the state vying for the honor. The award represents the top school working to create an environment for students to be healthy, physically active throughout the school day, nutrition education offered in the classroom, and healthy meals served in the cafeteria. PSS received a check for \$500, which will be used to create a new paved walking trail behind the school. The award is confirmation that PSS students are on the right track and are engaged in living healthy lifestyles.





# Summer is here!



## ***In NH, that means enjoying the GREAT OUTDOORS!!!***

Trips to beaches, parks and campgrounds, boating, waterskiing, and barbeques with friends and family are just a few of the activities you can do in NH all summer long. If your summer plans include the consumption of alcoholic beverages, consider the safety risks of mixing summer fun with any amount of alcohol. A single drink can impact your ability to observe and react; two important skills that are necessary in the event of an emergency.

***Weigh the risks and choose responsibly.***



**Alcohol directly affects the brain. Drinking and swimming (or drinking while supervising children who are swimming) is a potentially deadly combination. According to the CDC, drowning is the second leading cause of death from unintentional injury among Americans ages 1 to 14 and alcohol is involved in 25-50% of water related deaths nationally.**



**According to research funded by the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA), alcohol may be involved in 60% of boating fatalities, including falling overboard and a boat operator with a BAC over 0.1% is 16 times more likely to be killed in a boating accident than an operator with 0% BAC.**



**If you enjoy hiking, walking, bicycling, or other outdoor physical activities, the combination of alcohol and summer sun can easily lead to dehydration. Symptoms include thirst, weakness, anxiety and even fainting; severe dehydration may induce collapse or even death. If you are under the influence of alcohol, you may remain dangerously unaware of these symptoms.**



### Inaugural Youth Summit at Lakes Region Community College!

Over 90 youth are expected to participate in the Inaugural Youth Summit at Lakes Region Community College on Friday, June 5, 2015. Youth in grades 7-11 will be representing more than ten communities. The goal of the Youth Summit is to bring together teen participants from across the region to discuss how to make central NH communities stronger, safer, and more youth-friendly. Participants will engage in conversation and develop an action plan to make a difference for themselves and their peers in the community.

This is the first initiative of its kind in central NH and aims to empower youth to take action to make their communities more youth friendly. Governor Maggie Hassan will be kicking off the event, ensuring participants that their voices will be heard by community leaders throughout the state.

The idea for the Youth Summit was developed by members of the Lakes Region Youth Services Symposium, a coalition of regional youth service organizations that have been meeting regularly since 2013.

There have been many local organizations involved in organizing the Youth Summit, including Appalachian Mountain Teen Project, Project Extra!, Granite United Way, Boys and Girls Club of the Lakes Region, Better Together Lakes Region, Pemi Youth Center, Stand Up Laconia. Lakes Region Partnership for Public Health, Family Planning and Freedom Found, as well as multiple anonymous donors.

The organizers are excited to share the results of this event with the surrounding community, however the Youth Summit is a closed event. ## A Walking Tour—Through the Grounds of the New Hampshire Veterans Association

Join us for a Walking Tour through the buildings and grounds of the N.H. Veterans Association on Tuesday, May 26. Participants will be guided by Association Historian Fred Merrill on a tour which will begin at Encampment Headquarters at The Weirs promptly at 6:00 pm.

Not long after their return home, New Hampshire Soldiers who fought in and survived the Civil War yearned to be reunited with fellow soldiers. Informal meetings ensued and numbers grew. In the early 1870s a number of regiments began to meet for long formal banquets. It was clear that there was an overwhelming desire for reunions.

In June 1875, the New Hampshire Veterans' Association was organized in Concord. Their aim was "simply to cherish those fraternal feelings engendered among men who devoted four of the best years of their lives for the maintenance of The Union". The first general reunion and encampment occurred in October of that year at the Riding Park in Manchester. In 1878, The NHVA held its second reunion and encampment – its first at "Weirs Landing" (Weirs Beach). The Encampment Headquarters building located on Lakeside Avenue was built in 1885.

This tour is a rare opportunity for you to take a walk through history and to peek inside these architecturally amazing buildings that have been an attraction for so many years here at The Weirs.


