New Hampshire Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Ceremony


On Monday, May 19, 2014, the law enforcement community gathered to honor its fallen heroes.

Present at the ceremony was Chief Chris Adams and members of the Dolloff family who came to place the flower for Laconia's own Charles Dolloff who died in the line of duty on July 18, 1889. Officer Dolloff died of an apparent brain aneurism after subduing a riot at the horse races held at what is now Opechee Park.

Union Ave. Construction Project

As we work on improving our roads, you may have noticed significant activity on Union Avenue. Work at that location during this construction season includes water main, natural gas, sewer, road and sidewalk upgrades.


The project will be in two phases, currently anticipated to be as follows: Phase 1-Messer St. to approx. Walker St., roadway and utilities: April 7th thru May 23rd (sidewalk and curb work continuing until June 13th); Phase 2-Walker St. to Gilford Ave.: July 7th thru October 10th. During the construction day, traffic will be northbound only; southbound traffic will be detoured (see [Phase 1](#) and [Phase 2](#) detour plans). On weekends and evenings Union Avenue will be open to two-way traffic.

Laconia Fire Department has put in service an hydraulic lift on the back of the primary ambulance. The lift, which was purchased by LRGH at a cost of \$11,000, has the ability to lift the stretcher and patient from ground level to the ambulance. The capacity is 1,000 pounds. The lift actually collapses and slides in between the chassis rails.

Dan and Dave from the City's Public Works Maintenance Division installed the lift last week. This piece of equipment will be a huge benefit to help in preventing injuries to our firefighters when transporting large patients.

This lift is not part of the grant that we received from the State. That equipment will come in a few weeks and will be used to move patients inside the building. We are the only fire department in the northeast to install this equipment. It is manufactured in California.

Sweet and Sour Cauliflower with Sweet Potatoes

30 minutes

4 servings

214 calories per serving

Vegetarian, gluten-free

Ingredients

- 1 large cauliflower
- 3 oz. goat cheese
- 2 limes, juiced
- 1 tablespoon cane sugar
- 2 tablespoons coconut oil/olive oil
- Paprika
- Salt and pepper
- 2 sweet potatoes
- 10-15 asparagus spears

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 400F.
2. Slice the sweet potatoes into thin pieces and sprinkle with salt, pepper, and paprika.
3. Cook on a cookie sheet or pan lightly covered in oil for 25.
4. Slice the cauliflower into big slices and place them in a heated pan with olive or coconut oil. Cook these cauliflower slices with the sugar on medium heat for 4-5 minutes on each side.
5. Flip sweet potato slices. Sprinkle salt, pepper, and paprika again over potato slices, and cook for 25 minutes.
6. Place cauliflower on cookie sheet and sprinkle goat cheese on each slice.
7. Pour lime juice over the cauliflower before putting it into the oven.
8. Bake for 10 minutes at 400F. Lightly steam the asparagus and serve with the cauliflower and sweet potatoes.

Summer Safety Tips from the Laconia Fire Department!

Spring has sprung, and along with that comes yard clean up, barbecuing and other warm weather activities. We would like to share some safety information to help you have a fun, and safe, spring!

It's that time of year when we break out the lawn mowers and weed whackers to clean up winter's mess.

Here are a few things to remember when fueling up the gas cans before tackling your yard work:

Always use approved gas cans for carrying gasoline. Dispensing gasoline into any container not designed to carry flammable liquids is not only unsafe, it is illegal.

When filling your gas can place it on the ground and keep the nozzle in contact with the side of the fill opening. This allows for a proper grounding and gives the normally occurring static electricity a safe way to ground itself preventing a flash fire or explosion. Leaving it in the bed of a truck or on a trailer will not allow for grounding especially in vehicles with plastic bed liners.

Never transport gas cans inside the passenger compartment of your vehicle. It is also dangerous to leave them stored in the trunk, enclosed trailer or covered pickup bed as they may heat up and expand leaking fumes and liquid causing a hazardous situation.

Another area of concern is barbecuing. This seemingly safe event does have some rules to help you have an enjoyable experience:

Never spray lighter fluid onto an already burning or smoldering barbeque. The fire can quickly expand and/or the flames could travel back to the container causing injury or death.

If your gas grill doesn't light with in the first few tries, shut off the gas, leave the lid open and wait 2 or 3 minutes before attempting the lighting procedure. If you continue to attempt to light your grill without success, the gas could accumulate in the barbeque and flash or explode suddenly. A few minutes' wait could mean the difference between a safe grilling day and horrible burns.

Lastly, the City of Laconia ordinances require all gas and charcoal grills be kept a minimum of 10 feet from the structures that contain more than 2 family units. This includes condominium type buildings with more than 2 attached occupancies. If you are not sure of your situation, or you live in a different community, contact the local Fire Department for assistance and clarification.

Please see next week's Laconia Links for information on obtaining burn permits in the City of Laconia.
