**For the Maintenance
of the Union
The History of the
New Hampshire
Veterans' Association**

The newest exhibit located on the upper level of the Library is "For the Maintenance of the Union" - The History of the NH Veterans' Association. Not long after their return home, NH soldiers who fought in and survived the Civil War yearned to be reunited with fellow soldiers. In June, 1875, the NH Veterans' Association was organized with the aim to "cherish those fraternal feelings engendered among men who devoted four of the best years of their lives for the maintenance of the Union." The exhibit is cosponsored by the Laconia Historical & Museum Society and the Laconia Public Library. The Laconia Historical & Museum Society is offering a guided walking tour on June 10 @ 7pm through the buildings at the NH Veterans' Assoc. in the Weirs guided by Quartermaster Mike Young, starting at the Encampment Headquarters at the Weirs at 7pm. Taylor Community presents Duo Andacht in concert for the next performance in its 2014 Music Series sponsored by Bank of New Hampshire. The concert is scheduled for Sunday, June 8 at 3 p.m. in Taylor's Woodside Building and is free and open to the public.

Pianist Paul Dykstra and Cellist Beth Pearson formed their duo in 2008 and have been frequent performers on the New England stage. These include the Jean C. Wilson Music Series; the Abendmusik Series in Rye, N.H.; the Musicians of Wall Street Series in Concord; and Mechanics Hall in Worcester, where they completed a successful recording of the Brahms E minor Sonata.

Their performance made possible through the generous sponsorship of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Ouellette.

Pearson began her professional life as founder and cellist of the Apple Hill Chamber Players, and has performed more than 2,000 chamber music concerts throughout the U.S. Her solo appearances include Lincoln Center; the Gardner Museum; the Longy School; and Harvard and Smith colleges.

Dykstra is a Canadian-born and trained musician now living in New Hampshire, where he maintains a very active career as a solo and chamber music performer, teacher and recording artist. He's recorded world premiere offerings of modern music by American composers such as Norman Matthews, Edward Ficklin, Roger Rudenstein and with Richard Stolzman (clarinet), both in piano/clarinet combination and with the Slovak Radio Symphony Orchestra under Kirk Trevor.

UNION AVE.

Union Ave. Construction Project

As we work on improving our roads, you may have noticed significant activity on Union Avenue. Work at that location during this construction season includes water main, natural gas, sewer, road and sidewalk upgrades.

The project will be in two phases, currently anticipated to be as follows: Phase 1-Messer St. to approx. Walker St., roadway and utilities: April 7th thru May 23rd (sidewalk and curb work continuing until June 13th); Phase 2-Walker St. to Gilford Ave.: July 7th thru October 10th. During the construction day, traffic will be northbound only; southbound traffic will be detoured (see [Phase 1](#) and [Phase 2](#) detour plans). On weekends and evenings Union Avenue will be open to two-way traffic.

Vanilla Chia Smoothie

5 minutes

Serves 1

Vegan, gluten-free

Ingredients

- 1 banana
- 2 tbsp. chia seeds
- 1.5 cups almond milk
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract



Directions

If you like the texture of soaked chia seeds, soak yours in the almond milk for a bit. Add banana and vanilla extract. Blend with ice, optional. Enjoy! Chia seeds are hydrophilic. They can absorb up to 12 times their weight in liquid when soaked. While soaking, the seeds develop a mucilaginous gel-like coating that gives chia-based beverages a distinctive texture

Obtaining Burn Permits

With yard clean up going on many folks have a desire to burn the brush and debris that winter storms have left behind. Here are some pointers to guide you when you wish to burn outdoors:

- Laconia does allow outdoor burning with a permit. However, the rules and regulations concerning outdoor burning are dictated by the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands, not the City of Laconia.
- Both the Central Fire House at 848 North Main Street (just north of the Oak Street intersection) and the Weirs Beach Fire House at 7 Lucerne Ave (in the Weirs Community Center) are able to issue burn permits and members can give further clarification and guidance as well as give you hard copies of burning regulations. To view the full set of outdoor burning/burn permit regulations and laws you may also visit the NHDFL website at:
<https://www.nhdf.org/fire-control-and-law-enforcement/permits.aspx>
- You must be the property owner OR have the permission of the property owner to kindle fires. Each Fire House has a form that can be completed by the landlord/property owner to allow tenants to kindle a fire.
- ANY outside burning EXCEPT when using a gas or charcoal cooking fire contained in an off the ground container or grill, requires a burn permit.

The men and women of the Laconia Fire Department wish you a safe and happy spring. Please be safe and let's not meet "by accident"!
