## Union Ave. Construction Project

As we work on improving our roads, you may have noticed significant activity on Union Avenue. Work at that location during this construction season includes water main, natural gas, sewer, road and sidewalk upgrades.

The project will be in two phases, currently anticipated to be as follows: Phase 1-Messer St. to approx. Walker St., roadway and utilities: April 7<sup>th</sup> thru May 23<sup>rd</sup> (sidewalk and curb work continuing until June 13<sup>th</sup>); Phase 2-Walker St. to Gilford Ave.: July 7<sup>th</sup> thru October 10<sup>th</sup>. During the construction day, traffic will be northbound only; southbound traffic will be detoured (see [Phase 1](#) and [Phase 2](#) detour plans). On weekends and evenings Union Avenue will be open to two-way traffic.





## Gasoline Safety



Gasoline is probably the most common fuel in use today. People get very complacent when handling gasoline. Most people do not realize how easy gasoline can be ignited. This time of year we see a big increase in people filling portable containers; for use at home, on the island, or to fill the boat. Remember – gasoline is a very flammable liquid.

When filling portable containers you must put the container on the ground. Never fill the container inside a vehicle, in the bed of a pick-up truck, or on the bed of a trailer.

Always be sure the nozzle is in contact with the container and fill portable containers slowly.

Never fill to the top. Gasoline will vaporize in the summer heat and this can cause a container to expand and overflow. Always secure the container so it cannot tip over.

Use only approved containers and caps.

When pumping gasoline the free flowing liquid creates static electricity. In the right conditions a spark can be created at the container causing ignition.

Gasoline is heavier than air and will settle in low points – trunks, or the ground. Gasoline will ignite at minus 45 degrees F; it will ignite at any temperature. The warmer the air temperature the faster gasoline will vaporize and build up pressure. The faster gasoline vaporizes the higher the chance for accidental ignition. Gasoline can ignite from static electricity. This can happen when the tank is not in touch with the ground, such as filling the container in the bed of a truck. Static electricity can also build up on your body if you get back in the car while pumping. If you get back out and touch the container you could create a spark – BOOM.

Several years ago we had a very serious accident in the Weirs when two young men inadvertently used a wet vacuum to clean up a spill in a boat. Both men were seriously burned.

When filling boats everyone should be out of the boat. The engine and ignition should be off. BBQ grills are becoming common on boats – be sure there are no hot coals in the grill before fueling.

It takes very little energy to ignite gasoline vapors. Please take these precautions and always be on the safe side!

## **CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT**

The Consumer Confidence Report, or CCR, is an annual water quality report that a community water system is required to provide by law. In 1996, the U.S. Congress and the President amended the Safe Drinking Water Act by adding a provision requiring that all community water systems deliver to their customers an annual water quality report. The law specifies certain content for the reports, and requires water systems to distribute these reports to all of their customers.

The CCRs summarize information that water systems are required to collect. Included in the report is a description of our treatment process as well as water testing that was done in the previous calendar year. Also included is information on household liquid waste materials and awareness of fertilizer use for lawn care. Our water testing is extensive and it includes but is not limited to Microbiology (bacteria), Volatiles (fuels), Synthetics (pesticides), and Inorganics. Each year our test results are well below the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) and for the most part are below detection limits.

### What is the Difference between Refugees and Immigrants?

Refugees are forced to leave their home countries because of war, environmental disasters, political persecution and/or religious or ethnic intolerance. They come to the U.S. with a special immigration status that gives them automatic admission in the country and helps them connect with family members who are already in the country. This status also provides them with a "green card" or permit to work. Refugees are "invited" to live in the U.S. to start a new life.

Immigrants generally come to the U.S. for one of two reasons:

- They are going family members who already live in this county
- They are "economic immigrants" seeking work and a better life for themselves and their families

Refugees and Immigrants have a good deal in common. They experience new cultures and languages. They are often ethnic minorities who might face open discrimination or other forms of hostility, regardless of their immigration status.
