Throughout this school year, Mrs. Gamlin's 1st grade students participated in a computer coding course. 1st graders eagerly worked with Mrs. Gamlin and Mrs. Plourde through 18 lessons which included over 130 challenging puzzles both on the computer and through "unplugged" activities. Throughout these lessons, students learned about algorithms, sequencing, creating program loops and events; these experiences allowed students to become "producers" rather than simply "consumers" of technology. Students meaningfully collaborated with each other, while using problem solving skills as they persevered through increasingly rigorous puzzles. Students were highly engaged and were very proud of themselves as they mastered more difficult content each week.
