The 91st Motorcycle Week Race and Rally brought beautiful weather for the nine day event. Both weekends attracted larger crowds to the Weirs and beyond. Officers from the Laconia Police Department, New Hampshire State Police and several other police departments patrolled the Weirs and surrounding communities. Police Chief Chris Adams would like to thank all of the officers, agencies and support staff that helped make the event a success.

Overall, the 2014 Motorcycle Week Rally was safe and orderly. Unfortunately, one fatality occurred early on Saturday morning of the second weekend. Although the crowds were larger this year, attendees were very well behaved and friendly.

to decline, due to the efforts of law enforcement and the cooperation of most of the attendees. In 1998, there were 174 Protective Custody arrests in one night; this year there were a total of 95 arrests City-wide in nine days, 42 of which were for Public Intoxication. The Laconia Police Department also investigated 29 collisions, 7 of which resulted in injuries. The New Hampshire State Police investigated 5 collisions, including the fatality. The culture of "Bike Week" has changed from years past, resulting in more orderly crowds, fewer arrests and a decline in motorcycle fatalities. This trend is expected to continue in 2015. The men and women of the Laconia Police Department look forward to the 92nd Laconia Motorcycle Week Rally in 2015!






Teen Scene: Blackout Poetry Slam!



Four Alarm Fire — Davis Place, Laconia

My cell phone rang at 11:30 PM on Tuesday, February 25. LR-CERT was being activated for a major fire in Laconia. I put on my gear, including my boots, and I was out the door within ten minutes. The temperature was in the teens, and I was wearing my winter gear. I assisted an ambulance in my role as a rehab captain.

My View: Jennifer Muzzey

The fire at Davis Place was devastating. There were so many aspects and details that I am still seeing. I was involved in the fire scene from the time I arrived until I was sent in my rehab role. I assisted an ambulance in my role as a rehab captain. I was putting their gear, young and older, freezing in the cold, prepared for everything, just waiting to be beckoned for their service. These men and women are truly heroes.

Scoping the entire scene was a floor of ice and hoses, fire trucks and ambulances, police cars, CERTmobile, Red Cross and a wide array of volunteer vehicles. A CERT member at one entrance directing traffic, police at the other, a young couple searching for their two missing indoor cats, generous couple opening their business for warming and feeding of firefighters.



Fireworks Safety Tips

The 4th of July is almost here! The Laconia Fire Department wants to remind people to be very careful when celebrating our Independence Day, especially if you are going to use fireworks. Fireworks are very dangerous. Do not get complacent when using these explosives. According to the National Fire Protection Association, fireworks cause an estimated 15,000 fires nationwide. Those fires result in an estimated 60 civilian injuries and \$36 million dollars in direct property damage. Hospital emergency rooms treat an estimated 8,800 people for fireworks related injuries. More than half of those injuries will be burns. A significant number of injured will be young people, under the age of 15. Fountains, sparklers and novelties will account for many of the injuries. Sparklers burn at a temperature of 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit. A few years ago we had a major building fire that was started by the misuse of sparklers.

The best way to celebrate the holiday is to go to a public fireworks display. Check the newspapers to see what communities are providing fireworks displays. Laconia provides fireworks shows on July 3 at Weirs Beach and July 4 at Opechee Park.

If you do plan on using permissible fireworks you must be over 21 years of age and you must own the property or have the owner's permission. Permissible fireworks are allowed in Laconia. They may not be allowed in other communities. Keep children away from the fireworks especially while lighting them. Store the fireworks in a safe location and keep them secured. You should have a bucket of water readily available to put out any fires that may get started, and to protect yourself. Watch where the fireworks land and monitor the area for at least 30 minutes after you are done. Fireworks can land on roofs and in gutters and easily start a fire. We have not had any substantial rain for more than a week so be extra cautious of where the fireworks are landing.

The State Fire Marshal gives this advice:

"Be Prepared" before lighting fireworks.

- Purchase **only** New Hampshire Permissible Fireworks, available at licensed retail stores throughout the state.
- Purchase **only** the quantity that you will use.
- Permissible fireworks can **only** be displayed on property that you own, or have written permission from the land owner.
- Have a water hose or fire extinguisher nearby in case of an unanticipated fire.
- Create a clear level surface to display your permissible fireworks away from things that can burn, or easily ignite.

Call 911 immediately in the event of a fire or medical emergency, don't wait!

"Be Safe" when lighting fireworks.

- Adults 21 years of age or older should be the only person possessing and displaying permissible fireworks.
- Always wear eye protection.
- Always read and follow the safety directions provided on each firework device or package.
- Light only one device at a time and move away quickly.
- Keep all spectators at a safe distance.
- Do not use fireworks indoors.
- Be considerate of your neighbors, family pets and the environment. You could be liable for damages to another's property.

"Be responsible" when finished.

- Clean up all debris when you are finished.
- Devices that do not fire or discharge once they are lit are very dangerous; if a firework device does not fire or discharge, keep away for at least 15 minutes or more, then ensure that it has been filled with water, or placed in a bucket of water.
- Always make sure that unused fireworks, matches and lighters are secured and out of the reach of children.



Summer Art Classes at the Belknap Mill start in July



FranksArt will be offering classes at the Belknap Mill this summer for instruction that will expand the artist's perception and education in three focus areas.

For six weeks in July through August students will work on 2D to 3D - "Exploring the Dimensions of Art". This class is intended for middle and high school students (grades 6-12) and adults. Students will make a culturally significant two dimensional art piece the first three weeks. The last half of the class will be focused on experimenting with medium, texture and subject while making a three dimensional art work. Tuesdays 9:30-11:30am or 1:00-3:00pm. July 1st through August 5th.

For six weeks in July through August students will work with Chigiri-e-"*Painting with Paper*" (Japanese Torn Paper Art). Learn the historical and cultural significance of the Japanese art of Chigiri-e as you practice the rewarding techniques of this hands-on art form. Classes available for middle/high school students and adults Wednesdays 9:30-11:30am or 1:00-3:00pm. July 2nd through August 6th.

For six weeks in July students will explore self-expression through art making. July 3rd through August 2nd - "This Is Me" will provide opportunities for students to explore personal traits and characteristics as they discover methods to represent themselves through the creation of art projects. Classes are available for middle school students through adult ages on Thursdays from 9:30-11:30am or 1:00-3:00pm.
