

HUOT CENTER AWARDED 3M GRANT



The Huot Technical Center has been awarded a technology grant by the 3M Corporation to purchase a new 3D printer. The printer will support students in our Manufacturing Engineering Technology and Pre-Engineering tracks.

This printer utilizes thin layers of plastic to create life-like and, in some cases, working models of products. These 3D models allow engineers and designers to test a new product before going through the costly fabrication process. These printers can create anything from simple geometric shapes to working tools and almost anything else. While state-of-the-art when purchased, the Huot's current 3D printer is an older model and has become costly to maintain. The new printer will allow students greater flexibility in design and a faster "build-time" on projects.

The MET and Pre-Engineering program is taught by Ken Martin with program assistant Bill Gile. The class is at 100% enrollment capacity for the coming year. Students take a common foundation course before choosing a track in either Pre-Engineering or Manufacturing Technology. Both programs pull heavily from the Engineering By Design framework and are offer alignment to post-secondary schools in NH along with optional industry certifications.

3m is a global technology leader with a commitment to supporting education. The company has a facility in Tilton, NH.



SUMMER READING FOR LACONIA MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS

Research tells us that students who read, write and practice math over the summer perform better in school during September. They are less likely to need to spend time gearing up for learning in the fall.

Laconia Middle School requires all students to complete a Language Arts Summer Reading Assignment, which will be entered as a reading grade for the first quarter. The book contract must be completed for Language Arts class by **August 27, 2014.**

Motorcycle Week 2014 is now in the past and the Fire Department will be conducting an internal "After Action" discussion to look at lessons learned and any changes that may be needed.

It was a beautiful 10 days, possibly the best weather for Motorcycle Week in at least a decade! The crowds were fairly large every day. In the past the crowds would dwindle during the weekdays, but that did not happen this year. Overall the Fire Department handled 145 emergency calls and conducted more than 300 site inspections. 106 calls were medical emergencies, 10 patients were Status 1 or 2, which are high-risk patients. There was one fatal motorcycle accident on the final weekend. We responded to

13 motor vehicle accidents during the 10 day period. These numbers reflect an average Bike Week.

On the final weekend the Department handled 52 emergency calls in a 48 hour period. The bulk of the calls were between 2pm and 9pm. Throughout the 10 day event 56% of the emergencies were in the central Laconia area; 32% were in the Weirs; 6% in Lakeport; 3% in the north and south ends; and 3% to other towns. During the event we responded to a working chimney fire and a 2-alarm fire on the 7th floor of Sunrise Towers. Every day and night Fire Officers keep close watch on all the large and small venues looking for overcrowding, blocked exits and improper storage. All this is done to keep the public safe from fire and other safety concerns.

Chief Erickson extends his thanks to all of the men and women of the Laconia Fire Department for their extra efforts during this event. Everyone puts in many extra hours away from their families, all to keep the residents and visitors safe.







The Pride of the Belknap Mill – Book Release Event

The Belknap Mill is proud to host the book release event for *A History of the Belknap Mill: The Pride of Laconia's Industrial Heritage* written by Lakes Region historian, Carol Lee Anderson, on Friday, July 11 beginning at 6:00pm. The event is free and open to the public.

The Belknap Mill played a significant role in the hosiery industry with Laconia's Industrial Revolution during the nineteenth century. J.P. Morin purchased the Belknap Mill in 1913 and his family operated the business for three generations. With a personal investment, made by J.P. Morin, of \$100,000.00 in a hydro-electric power plant, the Belknap Mill began to produce its own electricity. With plenty of power, the Mill was in good position to increase production and established a contract from the military to supply its soldiers with socks during the World Wars, as well to produce hosiery for the general population of Laconia and beyond.

By 1969, the Belknap Mill had ended its operations as a hosiery mill. Under the Laconia Urban Renewal Plan many structures in downtown Laconia were razed. In the 1970s a non-profit organization was founded that came to the rescue of the Belknap Mill. The "Save the Mills Society" (today's Belknap Mill Society) bought the Mill and mounted a capital campaign. It defined its mission as to preserve and maintain the building and its history, promote the arts and humanities, and provide community services. Today the Belknap Mill is the only remaining example in the United States from the first stage of the Industrial Revolution. The fact that the building was left unaltered gives it a special and highly-significant historic value.

Visitors are welcome to arrive as early as 5:00pm on July 11 to tour the facility; browse the museum and art gallery spaces and learn more about what is currently happening at the Mill. Morin's great-grandson, J. Paul Morin, wrote the foreword of the book and will be at the book release to begin the evening's event. During the Meet the Author session, there will be a presentation, and a question and answer period followed by the book signing by the author.
