The Declaration of Independence after 240 Years: Still a Document for the Ages
Thursday, July 14 at 7 pm
Laconia Rotary Hall

At a time when the American people are dividing along social, cultural, economic, and class lines, and during an especially contentious and divisive presidential campaign season, it makes good sense for Americans to return to the Declaration of Independence to recommit themselves to the principles and objectives that launched this country and that should continue to define us as the "one People" that Thomas Jefferson referred to in the opening sentence of this historic document. We cannot understand what makes America special and what distinguishes us as a separate and distinct people within the global community unless we understand the Declaration of Independence. This lecture will be given by Dr. David E. Marion, Elliott Professor Emeritus of Government and Director of the James Madison Public Service Program at Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia.

Chamber Music - July 10



The event is free and open to the public, but reservations are requested by calling 524-5600.






The Crunchy Western Boys Friday, July 22, 2016

OPECHEE GARDEN CLUB PRESENTS "GLORIOUS GARDENS" ON JULY 16, 2016



Opechee Garden Club proudly presents its signature fundraising event, a summer garden tour, "Glorious Gardens", on Saturday, July 16, 2016, from 9AM-3PM, rain or shine, in the beautiful Lakes Region of New Hampshire. Of the six featured home gardens, four are located in Gilford, and two are in Meredith, not far from the Laconia city limits.

On this tour, four of these properties have spectacular mountain views, and two have beautiful vistas of Lake Winnepesaukee. Two of the gardeners have lived and gardened on their acreage for 36 and 42 years, respectively, while another has just begun working on and learning about the gardens inherited from the previous owner of 28 years. Some gardeners have designed and built water features in the yards or gardens, while others have chosen to share a preferred collection of items such as birdhouses, or "garden art" to augment the style or "feel" of the garden. Then, of course, there are all the gorgeous shrubs, trees, plants, blooming flowers, and in some cases, vegetables and fruits to be seen and appreciated as well. To enhance the gardens further, weather permitting, there will be a creative table setting with a floral design by a member of the Opechee Garden Club at each garden location, and in some gardens, "plein air" artists working on site as visitors pass by.

The \$25.00 per person ticket not only includes the self-guided tour of the six wonderful and unique gardens, but also a delicious luncheon, served from 11AM-2PM, at the air-conditioned Gilford Community Church, 19 Potter Hill Road, in Gilford. The luncheon is prepared and served by Opechee Garden Club members. This year's menu includes several freshly prepared salads, fresh fruit and homemade poppy seed sweetbread. Home baked cookies of all types, and other sweet treats will follow the meal at the dessert table. Cooling beverages, iced tea, lemonade and water will also be available.

Either before or after lunch, enjoy browsing in the Boutique, the Plant Sale and the Raffle, all located at the Church, for great selections and gifts. Advance tickets are currently available at the following locations:


