

Can you guess the #1 question the City is asked regarding recycling?
It's "what do I do with my plastic bags?"

Because Laconia has single-stream recycling and all materials are sorted mechanically, plastic bags of any kind, (even those marked "recyclable") present a sorting problem. Click [here](#) for a short video of the issues plastic bags can cause in a recycling receiving facility similar to the one the City uses.

So what should you do with your plastic bags? Locally, Hannaford Supermarket provides recycle bins for plastic bags at the main entrance of their store and they will be happy to recycle them for you.

To reduce your accumulation of plastic bags, you may want to consider using reusable bags when grocery shopping. Following are some advantages of reusable bags:

- Reusable bags save trees and water
- Reusable bags save gas and oil
- Reusable bags help reduce air pollution
- Reusable bags help our oceans and sea creatures
- Reusable bags can save 700+ single-use bags over the span of their lifetime!




Moulton Opera House Grand Drape



In this roundtable presentation, Carol Pierce, director of the Laconia Human Relations Committee, will help attendees understand the process of refugee resettlement in Laconia. She'll share stories of those refugees who recently arrived and the settlement process that takes place.

For several years Carol served as the Chair of the City of Laconia's Human Relations Committee. She now chairs the Refugee Connections Committee. She's helped many political refugees make the transition to becoming citizens who add a great deal to the Lakes Region economy, culture and community. Several groups have resettled in Laconia, most under the auspices of Lutheran Social Services.


