If there is an accident or injury we must be prepared to get to the person as quick as possible and then be prepared to remove the person safely.






The Colonial Theater Art Contest

The City of Laconia and private homeowners' associations are currently independently conducting milfoil management activities. Unfortunately, acting independently, in this case, is not the best way to properly coordinate and scientifically manage invasive water plants here in Laconia.

In response to this challenge The Laconia Conservation Commission has been tasked to form a local Aquatic Invasive Management Subcommittee (AIMS). In order to make that Committee a success we need volunteers to serve on it. Regularly scheduled meetings will be open to the public and occur from time to time. The Committee will be tasked to work closely with New Hampshire DES to develop a City wide milfoil plan.

The City is also seeking summer volunteer weed watchers! The Weed Watcher task requires only a few hours' time commitment for one day during each of the summer months. It's a great opportunity to spend time on our beautiful Lakes while you contribute to helping keep them that way. We cannot do it without volunteers. A Weed Watcher training opportunity will take place on Monday July 20, 2015 at the Woodland Heights Elementary School. Call Lisa Morin at (603) 527-5880 if you want to participate in this training. Additional training will be held on Wednesday, August 29th at 6 pm at the Meredith Community Center (see below).
