The Water Department began a painting program last year in which a fresh coat of paint is applied to the hydrants and posts. This greatly enhanced the appearance and improved visibility of faded and weathered hydrants. This program was well received within the community and people have been asking if we are continuing it this year. As promised to the citizens, we are once again going around the City painting the hydrants and the posts starting with the high visibility areas.

The Water Department has made this painting program a yearly event and is trying to get to 15 percent of its hydrants each year. This means that a hydrant should not go more than 6-7 years before it gets a fresh coat of paint. With this said, we are asking for your patience and understanding that it may take some time before we get to the hydrants near your residence.



## HEAT WARNING!!



It is going to be another hot week! This is the fourth time this summer that we have experienced prolonged heat and humidity. We recommend a few tips – dress lightly, stay out of the direct sun, and drink plenty of water. If you need to get out of your home because of the high temperatures the City Library is open from Monday to Thursday 9 am to 8 pm, Friday from 9 am to 6 pm, and Saturday from 9 am to 4 pm. Other options are to go to the Senior Center on Church Street. In addition, all of the City beaches are open and free and the Belknap Mall is air conditioned.

A problem in New England is that the humidity levels actual slow down the body's ability to cool down. The body cannot evaporate internal heat as easily when the skin is wet.

Heat exhaustion and heat stroke are serious medical emergencies. Dizziness, weakness, fast heartbeat, headache, muscle cramps, nausea and vomiting are signs of heat emergencies. Get into the shade and drink plenty of water. If you do not improve within a few minutes call 911. Heat exhaustion can lead to heat stroke which is a true emergency. Signs of heat stroke are fever, seizures, confusion, skin is hot and dry; this is a life threatening condition – call 911.

Balla Kouyaté, one of the greatest balafon players in the world today, will bring the sounds of Afro Pop with his dancers. Balla plays two balafons with astounding speed, moving effortlessly between them. The balafon is a West African ancestor of the marimba and xylophone. Balla Kouyaté has been featured on 45 albums, some of which were Grammy-nominated and Grammy-winning. In 2007 he formed “World Vision”, a group of artists that has performed at the Chicago World Music Festival, Musikfest, and the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. Balla received the 2010 Massachusetts Cultural Councils Fellowship in the Traditional Arts. His music has been recorded at the Library of Congress.

## *We are Family—Three Sisters Reside at Taylor Community*

How likely is it that three sisters from Norwood, Massachusetts would end up living at the same retirement community in NH? Very likely as it turns out. Sisters Janina Majcher, 98, Irene Barninger, 95 and Sue Knowles, 93, are all residents at Taylor Community in Laconia. Sue moved in first in 1993 with her late husband, Deryck. Janina followed in 1997 and Irene in 1999. What brought them to Taylor? “It had a good reputation,” said Irene matter-of-factly. All three women enjoy having their own apartments, yet take comfort in the fact they can still be a family at Taylor.

Growing up, Irene said the three were very different. Janina suffered from Polio as a child. She was an accomplished pianist, spending hours practicing. “She had small hands with a delicate touch and was very good at sewing and crocheting, making cloth dolls and toys, which she sold off our back porch.” “Jan was smart,” added Sue. “She skipped a grade.” Irene spoke of Jan’s sense of humor.

Today Jan lives in the Nursing section of Taylor. Although her health isn’t the best, she enjoys having Sue come and read to her nightly. Irene manages the library in her building and regularly sends books up to Sue. “Every night she asks if I can come back tomorrow,” said Sue with a smile. Irene is proud of the sisters’ strong, Polish background. Both she and Sue raved about their mother’s cooking and the traditional Polish dishes she would make.

Irene, who was happiest when working with figures, made a career as a bookkeeper until retirement. She moved to a condo following her husband’s passing. After breaking her hip and the subsequent healing, she decided to move to Taylor. Though Irene has her health issues as well, she remains upbeat and is a regular participant in Taylor Home daily functions. Besides being in charge of the assisted living’s library, she’s a participant of the Chorus.

Sue was the athlete, playing baseball and volleyball and after she married, golf. She also enjoyed cooking and singing. “When I was in my 20’s Irene and I were in Boston and saw a place where you could make a recording. Irene insisted I go in and I made two records. My son still has them today,” she said. While she had aspirations of being both a singer and a dietician, Sue ended up becoming a registered medical secretary, which she really enjoyed.

She also helped name one of the streets on the Taylor Community campus. “We used to live on Fox Hollow Lane. The postman came by one day and said they were thinking of renaming it because there were too many streets beginning with the letter F in town. He suggested we get together with our neighbors and come up with a new name.” Sue took the first letters from the names of the two other couples on the block as well as she and her husband’s and tried to play around with them. The group had recently gone to the movies together to see “Amadeus.” The letters she had and the movie title matched and she suggested they change the name to Amadeus. Everyone liked the idea and the post master agreed. Today it is known as Amadeus Drive.

Both women credit their longevity to good genes. Their mother lived to be 89 and their father, 94. Irene’s philosophy on life is based on reading “The Power of Positive Thinking” many years ago. “I try to keep a happy, positive attitude,” she said. Sue’s rule to live by is to be as honest as you can. “Try to be understanding and empathetic of others, especially the elderly. Some day that will be you,” she said.

## *Downtown TIF Advisory Committee*


The Downtown TIF Advisory Committee has been hard at work on a Gateway Improvement Project for Downtown. The TIF Advisory group helps advise the City Council on projects in the Downtown area that are paid from the TIF fund. The TIF fund, or Tax Increment Financing fund, is revenue specifically from taxes on redevelopment projects in the Downtown area. The revenue in the TIF fund from the Downtown is then spent on public projects in the Downtown in an effort to provide incentive for more private investment and redevelopment.

The Advisory group is trying to coordinate with the upcoming Main Street Bridge project to complete a Gateway improvement for Downtown. The group plans to tie construction of the project directly to the bridge construction to save on cost.

The design below includes seating to view the river including shaded seating under a pergola, increased green areas and plantings, additional lighting and brick walkways connecting to the Riverwalk. The cost of the project is close to \$400,000. The price includes special designs to incorporate the project onto the bridge deck (identified in the image below with a red dashed line). Improvements on the bridge deck must include special accommodations for drainage and utilities such as irrigation and electric. Completing this project will provide a park for Downtown businesses and their employees to use as well as a beautiful, welcoming gateway to the Downtown community.

The Downtown TIF Advisory Committee will be at the July 22 Council Meeting presenting this project as well as other projects for the Riverwalk and WOW Trail. Please let us know what you think!!
