

## CITIZEN POLICE ACADEMY




- Have you ever wondered what it would be like to be a police officer?

The Laconia Police Department will again be hosting an annual Citizen Police Academy in order to afford its citizens the opportunity to experience our department in a fun and unique way.

The class will begin on Tuesday, September 16th and run through Tuesday, November 18th. The purpose of the Academy is to increase understanding between the public and the department through education and interaction with police officers. ## Union Ave. Construction Project

As we work on improving our roads, you may have noticed significant activity on Union Avenue. Work at that location during this construction season includes water main, natural gas, sewer, road and sidewalk upgrades.

The project is planned in two phases, with the second phase currently anticipated as follows: Phase 2—Walker St. to Gilford Ave.: July 7<sup>th</sup> thru October 10<sup>th</sup>. During the construction day, traffic will be northbound only; southbound traffic will be detoured (see [Phase 2](#) detour plans). ## Blue Moon – August International Film Series - 2014

The Laconia Human Relations Committee in cooperation with the Laconia Public Library offers the film *Blue Moon* as a part of the Laconia International Film Series collection. 

WHERE ARTS AND HISTORY COME TO LIFE

## The Belknap Mill Presents: Esteemed Architectural Historian Richard Guy Wilson



Architectural historian, television commentator and author, Richard Guy Wilson, will present 'Wild and Colorful: Victorian Architecture in Laconia and New Hampshire' on Thursday, August 14 at 6pm. The presentation will be held on the 3rd floor of the Belknap Mill in Laconia.

Wilson will speak about the architectural heritage of New Hampshire's Victorian buildings--houses, mills, court houses, rail road stations, libraries and stores created between the 1830s and early 1900s. This presentation will examine these unique buildings with a focus upon Laconia and the Lakes Region. During the lecture, Wilson will provide a slide show that explores elements of visual literacy and point out how architecture can reflect the cultural and civic values of its time and place.

Wilson holds the Commonwealth Professor's Chair in Architectural History at the University of Virginia, where he also serves as chair of the Department of Architectural History. A graduate of the University of Colorado and the University of Michigan, Wilson has received a number of academic honors, among them a Guggenheim fellow, prizes for distinguished writing, and in 1986 he was made an honorary member of the American Institute of Architects (AIA). He received the outstanding professor award at the University of Virginia in 2001. He has directed the Victorian Society's Nineteenth Century Summer School since 1979 that has been located in Boston, Philadelphia and currently Newport, RI. He has served as an advisor and commentator for a number of television programs on PBS, C-Span, History Channel and A&E; he appeared on most of the sixty-seven segments of *America's Castles*.

A frequent lecturer for universities, museums and professional groups, he is also published widely with articles and reviews to his credit. He is the author, joint author and/or editor of 16 books that deal with American and modern architecture. Among the most recent publications include *Edith Wharton at Home: Life at the Mount* (2012), *Harbor Hill: Portrait of a House* (2008) and a reissued new edition of *Thomas Jefferson's Academical Village* (2009).


