


Adult Fall Book Discussion

Offered by HOMEteam in Partnership with Laconia Area Community Land Trust

Laconia, NH – On October 1st, 2016 HOMEteam will be hosting a free seminar for those interested in learning and understanding the risks and responsibilities of being a landlord or owning a multifamily home. At this seminar participants will learn about the rewards, liabilities, and obligations associated with two-to-four-family homes. The class features presentations from a home buyer counselor, lender, and attorney, and runs from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m at River's Edge 126 Union Ave, Laconia NH 03246

Laconia Area Community Land Trust, NeighborWorks® Southern New Hampshire, and CATCH Neighborhood Housing have partnered to create HOMEteam, a counseling agency dedicated to providing home ownership education and counseling in New Hampshire. HOMEteam provides New Hampshire residents in 84 towns and cities with the information and tools they need to make smart financial decisions related to purchasing, renting, and maintaining a home. Through a series of workshops, one-on-one counseling, and other resources, HOMEteam helps first time home buyers navigate the mortgage process, renters save for home ownership, and home owners preserve and protect their investment in their home.

CA\$H Coalition of the Lakes Region — Volunteer Mentor Description

The CA\$H (Creating Assets, Savings & Hope) Coalition of the Lakes Region seeks 10 adult volunteers to serve as mentors for adults of low-to-moderate income, with a desire to improve one or more areas of their personal financial management.

Time commitment: Approximately two hours every two-to-three weeks over an eight month period from October 2016 through May 2017.

Program description: Mentors and participants will be expected to attend group meetings (one every 4-6 weeks). There will be a general session on a topic specific to financial management with time for individual discussion. Goal-setting will be part of the individual discussion, based on either the session’s topic or one more relevant to the participant’s situation. Scheduled dates are:

December 6

January 10
February 21

March 21
May 2

June 6th:
Graduation!

Some of the goal areas/discussion topics will include developing a saving and spending plan, managing the holidays without going deep into debt, paying for college, credit building and repair. In the time between meetings, mentors will be expected to discuss financial goals and progress toward meeting those goals with their “mentee”.

Training: A training session for all mentors will be provided, scheduled for October 11, shortly before the program begins. It will include a review of resources to refer participants who need more extensive assistance in such areas as job search, credit repair, managing their household budget and other relevant topics.

Matching: Mentors will be paired with participants at the first session, to be held in October.

Participants: People with a desire to make improvements in their financial lives will self-refer or be referred by others. Participants will either be employed or actively seeking employment. Program staff will conduct a conversation with prospective participants to assess their readiness for success.

Reporting: Tylaine Guarriello from the Family Resource Center of Central NH in Laconia, where groups meetings will be held, along with Karen Wilson of Bank of NH, will supervise the program.

OPECHEE GARDEN CLUB PRESENTS "BONSAI"



Opechee Garden Club is pleased to announce a lecture and demonstration program titled, "Bonsai", presented by Fred McMullen, a Bonsai aficionado, disciplined in the care and training of these unique plants. The Business Meeting and Speaker Presentation will take place on October 3, 2016, at 1:00 P.M., at the Gilford Community Church, Potter Hill Road, in Gilford.

Bonsai is an art form originating and practiced in Asia for many centuries. Bonsai trees can be grown from the same seeds as trees that grow to full size, however, they are grown and trained so that they remain small and elegant. If preferred, one can forage for a very young tree in the wild, and, with care, adapt it to a potted environment before beginning to train it. Bonsai trees may be grown either outside or inside, depending on the type of tree. Once a tree is ready for training, a particular pruning style, of which there are dozens, must be chosen, and the tree prepared with wiring before the pruning, with special small tools, is begun. Since each time pruning is done growth begins in another part of the tree, knowing where and when to prune is a vital part of the art of Bonsai, and takes a lot of practice.

Our speaker, Fred McMullen, has always been interested in horticulture. While still in high school, he worked at Poore's Greenhouses in Portsmouth, NH. After earning two degrees in Plant Science at the University of New Hampshire, in Durham, Fred worked at two large greenhouses, Lexington Gardens, and Pearsons, both in Massachusetts, where he advanced from "assistant grower" to "senior grower".

He then returned to Durham, NH, as the superintendent of the University's Research Greenhouse range, where he met Dr. Radcliff Pike, the University's Naturalist for all plant placement and selection. Dr. Pike, who had visited both Japan and China learning about the culture of Bonsai, introduced Fred to Bonsai with the care of a Bonsai juniper. This particular Bonsai had an impressive history, as it was given in appreciation by Japan to the United States, and the then President of the United States Theodore Roosevelt, who brokered the 1904 Japanese/Russo Peace Treaty ending the war between Russia and Japan. The actual Peace Treaty was signed in Portsmouth, New Hampshire in 1905.

In 1980, McMullen and his family relocated back to Portsmouth where he purchased Poore's Greenhouses, renaming it Portsmouth Flower and Garden, and there began honing his Bonsai skills daily. Today Fred continues to enjoy the hobby tremendously, and has a wonderful array of "collected" Bonsai, those that have been acquired from previous owners. Talking to folks about Bonsai and its culture is always high on his list of "things to do".

Hospitality Chairs, Lynne DeVivo and Betty Hovey, and their Committee, Edythe Adams, Cynthia Beebe, Betsy Bright, Karen Coppi, Linda Frawley, Ginnie Johnson, Bev Martin, Joyce McMath, Rosemary Murphy, and Eileen Russillilo will provide refreshments and table décor. While the Business Meeting begins at 1:00 P.M., members and their guests are encouraged to arrive early, 12:30 - 1:00 P.M., to socialize before the meeting begins. Melissa Pacini has been hired as the social worker in the Middle and High schools. Melissa comes to our school district with many years of experience in the social work field. For the past eight years, Melissa has been a child protective services worker with The Division for Children, Youth and Families (DCYF) here in Laconia. Prior to DCYF, she worked with children and families at Genesis Behavioral Health and The KEY Program in NH/MA. Melissa has worked with children and families who experience issues such as domestic violence, substance abuse, mental illness, incarceration, and foster care/adoption. She is certified in Strength Based Casework (SBC) as well as trauma assessment strategies.
