26th Annual Debra Bieniarz Award


This award is presented annually by the Laconia City Council to a resident of the City based on his/her work with the youth of the community.

The Laconia Police Department completed a fitness challenge administered by Interlocal Trust between March 2013 and August 2013. The challenge, named "Trust Bucks", involved 34 employees participating in events such as: strength challenge, aerobic challenge, road races, sports activities, wellness classes, biometric screening, pre-fitness assessment and post-fitness assessment.

Each event afforded participants the opportunity to earn "Trust Bucks" which would be used toward the purchase of a commercial grade treadmill for the LPD fitness room. Based on the "Trust Bucks" earned during this program, Interlocal Trust will reimburse LPD 75% out of a possible 90% for the purchase of the treadmill.

Laconia and Gilford were dispatched to a reported building fire on Saturday night, September 28th, at 8:48 pm at Christmas Island Motel – 630 Weirs Boulevard. Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid reported multiple calls being received and flames were visible from their camera.

Captain Beattie requested a first alarm and verified it was the motel, not the restaurant. He arrived from the Weirs in four minutes and reported heavy fire conditions in the 150' x 40' two-story wood frame motel.

Thanks to the efforts of area Fire Departments, the fire was knocked down fairly quickly. However, final extinguishment took hours. A crew remained on-scene all night.

The State Fire Marshal, ATF, Laconia Fire and Police are investigating this fire. CERT assisted with traffic control.

Earlier that same Saturday morning at 2:08 am there was a one-alarm fire at Pitman's Freight Room on New Salem Street. That fire was quickly extinguished and the facility should re-open mid-week. That fire is also under investigation.


