





# Public Service of New Hampshire

*Public Service of New Hampshire will  
be working on the following pending  
projects to ensure continued reliable  
service to Laconia residents:*

**Downtown underground project** - For improved reliability, PSNH will be installing a new underground primary line (in conduit) down Union Ave., through the intersection of Main Street, creating a loop feed (power from two different sources) for this area. The current underground line is direct buried and out of date. Under the current configuration, if this line fails the power outage would be prolonged and affect multiple customers due to the inability for PSNH to "re-feed" this section from a secondary source/ point. The new configuration, when affected by a power outage, will lessen outage time and reduce the number of customers and businesses impacted.

**Hilliard Road, 3 phase conversion** - PSNH will be upgrading from single phase to three phase power down Hilliard Rd. to enhance reliability and allow for added load, i.e. customer load growth. In preparation for the project, PSNH has contracted for tree trimming and is in the process of obtaining the trimming permissions. Both of these projects are slated to begin in the month of October and will be completed before the end of the year or the beginning of 2014.

If there are any planned outages due to this work, PSNH will notify everyone affected well ahead of time.



**CODE ENFORCEMENT**

October is when we enjoy the foliage but it is also the time that it can get a bit chilly in the am and pm. Not surprising that the Code Enforcement Office has begun to receive inquiries from tenants asking "When does the landlord need to turn on the heat?"

The answer to the parameters for heat are provided by several codes: The International Residential Code, International Property Maintenance Code and the International Plumbing Code for NH, as follows:

**Heat must be provided at 68 degrees from Oct 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013 until April 1, 2014 for Laconia, or if the outside temperature maintains less than 60 degrees on a given day.**

# Breast Cancer Awareness

**What is a mammogram?**  
A mammogram is an x-ray of the breast that is used to detect and evaluate breast changes.

With the air becoming crisp and leaves changing color, what better way to enjoy the beautiful fall weather and foliage than to participate in a walk for charity?

**When should I get a mammogram?**

The United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) recommends that women ages 50 to 74 should get a mammogram every 2 years. Women younger than age 50 should talk to a doctor about when to start and how often to have a mammogram.

The month of October is formally known as Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Thousands of men and women around the country raise awareness by wearing pink and participating in walks all across their state. Not only are citizens supporting a great cause, but they are also having fun and being active.

According to the Susan G. Komen Foundation, in 2010 Breast Cancer affected more than 1.6 million women worldwide. Although breast cancer is more prevalent in women, that does not excuse men from the disease. Approximately 1 in 1,000 men will get breast cancer. It's crucial for men and women to speak with a doctor if there is a family history of breast cancer.



The American Cancer Society's Making Strides Against Breast Cancer is the largest network of breast cancer awareness events in the nation. Funds raised from the Making Strides Walks help the American Cancer Society fight the disease with research, information and services, and access to mammograms for women who need them. ## From the Laconia Water Department

The Laconia Water Department recently completed a water line replacement project on Water Street at the intersection of Beacon Street West.



The project began by installing an isolation valve on Pleasant Street near the old Sundial Shop. This enabled us to reduce the number of temporary water lines that would have needed to be installed as well as reducing the number of times water service was interrupted to our customers. The replacement itself consisted of approximately 250 feet of 8-inch ductile iron cement lined pipe starting at the side of #12 Pleasant Street near the Rent-a-Center store and continued across Beacon Street West.



The excavation took approximately one week and our plan at this time is to reclaim the roadway and pave next week.
