It's a sure sign of the season... Laconia's Winter Parking Ban is in effect.




As of November 1st, parking is prohibited on a public street between 12 midnight and 6:30 am until May 1st.

Move Smart!!! Nighttime Safety Walking, Bicycling and Skateboarding Tips

The change in seasons along with the change in Daylight Savings Time may have you walking, bicycling and skateboarding in the dark ---- literally.

Walking

- Carry a flashlight to illuminate you and help drivers see you.
- Walk in well-lit areas and routes you are familiar with.
- Wear reflective material when walking at dusk or night.
- Face oncoming traffic and stay in designated walkways and paths.
- Always assume drivers will not see you, especially when crossing the street.
- Be aware of engine noises, backup lights, cars backing or pulling out of driveways and parking lots.
- Don't use headphones or talk on the phone. Share your walking route and return time with someone you trust.
- Walk with a friend or a pet.
- Wear a whistle or carry a small alarm to attract attention if you need help.



Bicycling

- Install reflectors on your bike. White for the front and red for the rear on pedals. Install a red spoke reflector on the rear wheel and amber on the front wheel.
- The law states you must have a white headlight on the front of the bike when riding at night.
- Dress in bright colors with reflective material.
- Ride with traffic and stay in designated areas.
- Always assume drivers will not see you, especially when crossing the street.
- Be aware of engine noises, backup lights, cars backing or pulling out of driveways and parking lots.
- Don't use headphones or talk on the phone.
- Share your bike route and return time with someone you trust.
- Ride with a friend.
- Wear a whistle or carry a small alarm to attract attention if you need help.
- If you are under the age of sixteen years old you must wear a bicycle helmet.



Skateboarding

- Skateboards, rollerblades and foot scooters cannot be as easily fitted with reflective gear as bicycles, making them harder to see.
- You should avoid risky situations, such as riding at dusk or at night, riding in or near traffic, or "skitching a ride," which is holding on to the side or rear of a moving vehicle while riding a skateboard.
- Ride in a safe environment. Children under age fifteen should never ride in the street, at night, or near traffic. Riding surfaces should be smooth and clear of debris or water.
- Always check your equipment before riding.
- Always wear your safety equipment. (Helmet and padding)

The City Zoning requirement 235:53-B (5) sets forth guidelines for placing political signs on private property. Please be considerate and do not place signs sooner than 30 days prior to an election and remove them within 10 days of the conclusion of an election. In addition, signs may not be placed on the property of any polling location; law enforcement/ Department of Public Works will remove all signs placed in violation. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Need help budgeting? Debt Triage to the Rescue!
