




# Upcoming Meetings...

It's been a very busy year for the NH Humane Society. We've assisted in a number of cases where large numbers of animals were in need of help. Recently we answered the call and mobilized immediately when local authorities discovered a large number of cats and two dogs in need of intervention. While such instances place a significant strain on our resources, the NH Humane Society is here to support our community. Sadly, we removed 27 cats and two dogs from living conditions that were less than healthy. The cats were desperately hungry, flea-ridden, and unvaccinated. All of them need to be spayed and neutered as well.

We depend on community members like you to help us care for the cats and dogs mentioned above and those already residing at the shelter. The NH Humane Society receives no government or national agency funding; we are a stand-alone 501(c)3 non-profit.


