

Thanksgiving Day Fire Safety

Over the past decade there has been a new trend for cooking turkeys - the turkey fryer. The traditional method of cooking a turkey could take hours; a turkey fryer can complete the job in less than an hour. Unfortunately, every year deep fat fryers are responsible for many fires and injuries. As the fryers become more common the fires and deaths will continue to increase. Because of the risks attributed to turkey fryers, Underwriters Laboratories will not certify any fryer with their trusted UL mark and many safety organizations warn against their use. The majority of reported incidents occurred while the oil was being heated, prior to adding the turkey. For this reason, it is very important consumers monitor the temperature of the oil closely. If any smoke at all is noticed coming from a heating pot of oil, the burner should be turned off immediately because the oil is overheated. A flash fire can occur very quickly at this point.

Should you choose to fry turkeys please follow these safety guidelines:

- Turkey fryers are not meant to be used indoors.
- Keep the fryer in FULL VIEW while burner is on.
- Do not let children get anywhere near the fryer.
- Place the fryer in an open area AWAY from all walls, fences, or other structures.
- Never use IN, ON, or UNDER a garage, breezeway, carport, porch, or any structure that can catch fire.
- Raise and lower food SLOWLY to reduce splatter and avoid burns.
- COVER bare skin when adding or removing food.
- Check the oil temperature frequently.
- If oil begins to smoke, immediately turn gas supply OFF.
- If a fire occurs, immediately call 911.
- DO NOT extinguish a grease fire with water.



Follow these guidelines if you decide to use a turkey fryer:

- ▶ Make sure there is at least 2 feet of space between the liquid propane tank and fryer burner.
- ▶ Place the liquid propane gas tank and fryer so that any wind blows the heat of the fryer away from the gas tank.
- ▶ Center the pot over the burner on the cooker.
- ▶ Completely thaw (USDA says 24 hours for every 4 to 5 pounds) and dry turkey before cooking. Partially frozen and/or wet turkeys can produce excessive hot oil splatter when added to the oil.
- ▶ Follow the manufacturer's instructions to determine the proper amount of oil to add. If those are not available:
 - Place turkey in pot
 - Fill with water until the turkey is covered by about 1/2 inch of water
 - Remove and dry turkey
 - Mark water level. Dump water, dry the pot, and fill with oil to the marked level.

Remember...you are heating combustible oil to a very high temperature. There could easily be several gallons of oil in the fryer. If this ignites it will create a very serious fire and produce huge amounts of thick black smoke. The Fire Department dealt with one of these fires about 15 years ago. It wasn't a Thanksgiving turkey, however, the resulting fire destroyed the home's kitchen and left major damage to the rest of the home.

NOTICE OF CLEANING AND INSPECTION OF SANITARY SEWER MAINS

News & Updates

The City has contracted this required maintenance for the long term evaluation of these vital underground utilities on your street. Please take notice of equipment and personnel as they may cause minor traffic inconveniences while performing their work.

Occasionally, during sewer cleaning, air pressure in the sewer main can cause water to splash out of toilets, sinks and drains in your home. Please take the following precautions to prevent water damage to your home:

- Close lids and cover toilet bowls when not in use. We remind you that the water could come from this type of incident is from the bowl itself.
- The common causes of air venting in and out of homes during sanitary sewer cleaning are:

Air movement from normal cleaning operations, the use of higher pressure needed when cleaning sanitary sewer lines that have a steep slope, sewer lines running close to the building, a plugged roof vent, and the size and complexity of the home's ventilation system. This is why we ask you to keep the toilet lid down to minimize water splashing out of your toilet bowl.

The most common question from residents after receiving this notice is "When will they be on my street?" Due to variables in cleaning operations it is impossible to be answer this question accurately. Look for the contractor's (Ted Berry Company) red and white trucks and when they are near your street it is time to take the precautions mentioned above.
