Old Business-

New Business- Northeast Ice Cream renewal for another two months. It was brought to the boards attention the ice cream truck is pulling into the drive in after they have been told not to. They also received a complaint that it is pulling into the waterslide. A letter will go out letting the vendor know he is not allowed in the drive in and if he is parked on Lakeside Ave. he needs to feed the meters. Motion to approve by Chairman Rogato, seconded by Chief Moyer, passed.

Seasonal Loudspeaker – The board was notified that a seasonal permit would be requested next year from the Hells Angels on the property located at White Oaks Road. There is a question as to whether or not they need to pay for a quarterly license or each time they need to use a speaker. The board decided that they need to research this and find out how much they have been charged in the past.

A complaint was received about a door to door salesman that does not have a license. The resident wrote a check out and then voided it when they became suspicious. The police are aware of the situation and have told them they need to come in to get a license.

Pawn shops was brought up by Chief Moyer. There is no fee structure for pawn shops and the chief will explain to the officers that there is no license set up here at city hall and maybe a license could be developed in the future.

A lengthy discussion was brought up about the licensing chapter and that it is not clear about definitions for itinerant vendor and hawker along with other wording that may need to be looked at. It was suggested that the city attorney take a look at the chapter and maybe update the ordinance if needed. An itinerant vendor is not in this state and a vendor is in the state working in a regular place of business.

Adjournment-.Motion to adjourn by Chief Moyer, seconded by Chief Erickson, adjourned.
