

NOTICE OF CLEANING AND INSPECTION OF SANITARY SEWER MAINS

The City has contracted this required maintenance for the long term evaluation of these vital underground utilities on your street.

Please take notice of equipment and personnel as they may cause minor traffic inconvenience while performing their work.

Occasionally, during sewer cleaning, air pressure in the sewer main can cause water to splash out of toilets, sinks and drains in your home. Please take the following precautions to prevent water damage to your home:

Close lids and cover toilet bowls when not in use

We remind you that the water that could come from this type of incident is from the bowl itself.

The common causes of air venting into homes during sanitary sewer cleaning are: air movement from normal cleaning operations, the use of higher pressure needed when cleaning sanitary sewer lines that have a steep slope, sewer lines running close to the building, a plugged roof vent, and the size and complexity of the home's ventilation system. This is why we ask you in order to minimize water splashing out of your toilet bowl, keep the lid down.
